Product Information

The HP Mouse is a wireless mouse that can be connected to a computer using the HP Unifying Dongle or Bluetooth. It has programmable buttons and a scroll wheel for easy navigation.

- Programmable forward button (1): By default, press to display the next page in your application history.
- Programmable back button (2): By default, press to display the previous page in your application history.
- Programmable right-click button (4)
- Programmable scroll wheel (5)


Product Usage Instructions

To use the HP Mouse:

- 1. Connect the mouse to a computer using the HP Unifying Dongle or Bluetooth. Up to two computers can be connected via Bluetooth.
- 2. Press the programmable buttons to navigate through your application history.
- 3. Use the scroll wheel to scroll up and down in your applications.
- 4. If you want to program the buttons for different functions,refer to the user manual for instructions on how to do so.

Connect the mouse to one computer using the HP Unifying Dongle and up to two computers via Bluetooth®. Use the HP Accessory Center (HPAC) software to program the mouse buttons, change the DPI setting (1200 DPI by default), and use the dongle with the mouse's pairing button. If the software does not download automatically, on your computer, open Microsoft Store or App Store. Search for HP Accessory Center, and then download the app.

Components description



1. Programmable forward button

By default, press to display the next page in your application history.

2. Programmable back button

By default, press to display the previous page in your application history.

3. Thumb button (programmable by HPAC)

By default, quick press to display all virtual desktops in Windows® 10 and Windows 11 (Task View) or macOS®

(Mission Control). When HPAC is installed and Gesture function is enabled, press and hold the thumb button and move the mouse to use the default Gesture functions.

1. Mouse up: Zoom in

2. Mouse down: Zoom out

3. Mouse left: Brightness -

4. Mouse right: Brightness +

5. Scroll up: Scroll left

6. Scroll down: Scroll right

4. Programmable right-click button

5. Programmable scroll wheel

Scrolls the screen up or down. Click to use functions programmed in the app. By default, click to use application-specific functions, and click and hold to scroll when you move the mouse up or down.

6. Battery light

White (5 s): The mouse is on.

Blinking amber: The mouse needs to be charged.

Solid amber: The mouse is charging.

Solid white: The mouse is fully charged and connected to power.

7. HP Unifying Dongle light

Slowly blinking (180 s): The dongle is in pairing mode.

Solid (5 s): The dongle is connected to the mouse successfully.

8. Pairing button

Press to switch between channels.

Press and hold for 2 s to enter pairing mode for the selected channel.

9. Mouse dongle light

Two blinks and a pause (180 s): The mouse is reconnecting to a previously paired dongle.

Solid (5 s): The mouse connection or reconnection was successful.


Slowly blinking (180 s): The dongle channel is currently selected and the mouse is in pairing mode.


10. Bluetooth pairing lights Two blinks and a pause (180 s): The mouse is reconnecting to a previously paired device.


Solid (5 s): The mouse connection or reconnection was successful.


Slowly blinking (180 s): The Bluetooth channel is currently selected and the mouse is in pairing mode.






