With measurements of 4.33 x 2.36 x 3.15 inches and a weight of only 2.12 ounces, the toy is small enough for little hands or pets to handle. The plush, soft material is safe and pleasant to touch, and the AA batteries make it last for hours of fun. 

FEATURES

• **Hanging Design**: This chickadee toy is made to be hung from door frames or handles. When your cat touches it, it will wiggle and fly back and forth, making for fun play.



• Battery Operated: It runs on AA batteries (not included) and keeps moving so your cat stays interested without you having to move the toy yourself.



- Chirping Mechanism: It has a built-in chirping feature that sounds like a bird, which will appeal to your cat's natural urge to hunt.
- Adjustable Elastic Rope: The toy has an elastic rope that can be stretched from 3 feet to 6 feet (1.8 meters), so it can be placed in different ways and be used for interactive play.
- Naturally Soft Plush and Feathers: It's made of naturally soft plush and feathers, so it looks and feels like real food, which makes cats more drawn to it.
- The toy has a switch control system that lets you turn off the buzzing sound whenever you need to, so it won't bother your cat (or you).
- **Boosts Hunting Instincts**: The movement, singing, and feathers help boost your cat's natural instincts to hunt and pounce, which is good for its health.
- This toy helps your cat do both mental and physical tasks, which keeps them from getting bored and keeps them active.
- Ideal for Indoor Cats: This is a great way for indoor cats to play and burn off energy since they may not get as much natural excitement.
- Stress Reliever for Cats: This toy can help your cat feel less anxious and stressed by giving them something fun to play with and thinking about during the day.
- **Durable Construction**: The toy is made of materials that won't wear down quickly, so it can be played with over and over again without breaking.

SETUP GUIDE

- Remove carefully: Open the box and check that all of the parts are still together. This includes the toy, the feathers, and the stretchy rope.
- **Putting in Batteries**: Put AA batteries in the battery box. Make sure that the batteries are put in the right way, with the right voltage.
- **Test the Toy**: Once the batteries are in, turn the toy on and listen for sounds and movement to make sure it works right.
- Attach to Door Frame: Use a door frame, handle, or any other strong surface that can hold the length of the stretchy rope to hang the toy.
- You can change the length of the rope by stretching it from 3 feet to 6 feet. This will depend on how far you

want the chickadee to fly and how much room your cat has to play.

- **Putting the Toy Down**: Put the toy down somewhere your cat is likely to see it, like near their favorite place to rest or play.
- **Buzzing**: Press the switch to turn on the buzzing sound. You can also press the switch to turn it off if you'd rather play quietly.
- Secure Hanging Point: Make sure the elastic rope is tightly connected to the hanging point so it doesn't come off while you play.
- Watch the First Play: When your cat plays with the toy for the first time, make sure they like how it moves and sounds
- Change the Hanging Height: If you need to, change the toy's height to fit your cat's jumping and pouncing skills.
- As a teaser: Gently pull or tug on the stretchy rope to make the toy move around more, making it look like prey.
- Combine with Other Toys: Keep your cat fully engaged by putting other toys close that it can play with.
- Playing Interactively with Owner: You can play with your cat by using the toy with other cat teaser items, like rods or sticks.
- Safe Distance: Keep your cat away from the toy when it's not being played with to keep it from getting chewed on or damaged by chance.
- Option to be recharged (if available): If the model can be recharged, make sure to do so between play sessions.

CARE & MAINTENANCE

- Clean It Regularly: Use a wet cloth to wipe down the plush and feathers every so often to keep the toy clean and free of fur and dust.
- Check for Damage: Check the feathers and stretchy rope for damage every so often. If they get worn or broken, you should get new ones.
- Maintenance for batteries: Take the batteries out of the toy when not in use for a long time to stop them from leaking or corroding.
- Change the Batteries: If the toy stops moving or making noise, the AA batteries need to be changed to make sure it works at its best.
- Safely Store: Keep the toy in a safe, dry place when not in use to keep it from getting broken or lost.
- Avoid Water: Keep the toy away from water or damp places to keep the internal parts and battery area from getting damaged.
- Care for Feathers: If feathers start to lose their shape or color, you can either replace them with new ones of the same size or clean them gently with a soft brush.
- Don't Use Too Much Force: If you pull the toy too hard, you could damage the feathers or the stretchy rope.
- **Use Moderately**: The toy is a great way to get your cat to exercise, but don't leave it on all the time to save battery life and keep your cat from getting too excited.
- Clean the Rope: Fur or dust can get stuck in the stretchy rope. You can clean it by wiping it down gently or using a lint brush to get rid of dust and dirt.
- Check for Loose Parts: Before playing, make sure that all the parts are firmly attached, including the feathers and rope, so that no one can choke on them.
- Stop Chewing: Keep an eye on how your cat plays with the toy and stop them if they start chewing on the rope or other parts of it.

- Feather Replacement: If the feathers get worn out, you should get new ones to keep the toy looking nice and fun to play with.
- When it comes to battery compartment safety, make sure the area stays dry and free of dust. Look inside the area for rust or damage that has happened over time.
- Use for Supervised Play: The toy is made to be played with alone, but you should always watch your cat to make sure they're playing safely and properly with it.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Solution
The toy does not turn on	Ensure the battery is correctly installed and has been charged.
Chickadee does not respond to touch	Check if the batteries are properly installed and charged.
Sound is not working	Verify the volume is up and the battery is fresh.
Toy stops moving unexpectedly	Replace the AA batteries if they are running low.
The toy is not activating at all	Ensure the switch is in the "on" position.
Plush fabric becomes dirty	Spot-clean the plush fabric with a damp cloth.
Chickadee moves erratically	Reset the toy by turning it off and on again.
The battery compartment won't open	Use a small screwdriver to gently open the compartment.
Chickadee's movements are slow	Replace the batteries with new ones for optimal performance.
The toy overheats	Allow the toy to cool down before using it again.
Flopping action is not smooth	Check if there are any obstructions in the mechanism.
The toy makes an unusual noise	Inspect the toy for any loose parts or damage.
Chickadee is not activating on the first try	Press the activation button and ensure the toy is fully charged.
The toy falls over easily	Try placing the toy on a flat surface for more stability.
It runs out of battery too quickly	Turn off the toy when not in use to conserve battery life.

PROS & CONS
