Product Usage Instructions

Using Keyboard Functions

To use the keyboard functions:

1. To play/pause, press the corresponding key.
2. To mute volume, press the mute key.
3. To decrease volume, use the volume down key.
4. To increase volume, use the volume up key.
5. To navigate to the Internet home, press the respective key.
6. To launch the email application, press the corresponding key.
7. To place the PC in standby mode, use the standby key.
8. To launch the calculator, press the calculator key.

FAQ

Q: What is Unifying and how can I pair my device(s) via Unifying?

A: Unifying is a feature that allows you to pair multiple devices with a single receiver. To pair your device(s) via Unifying:

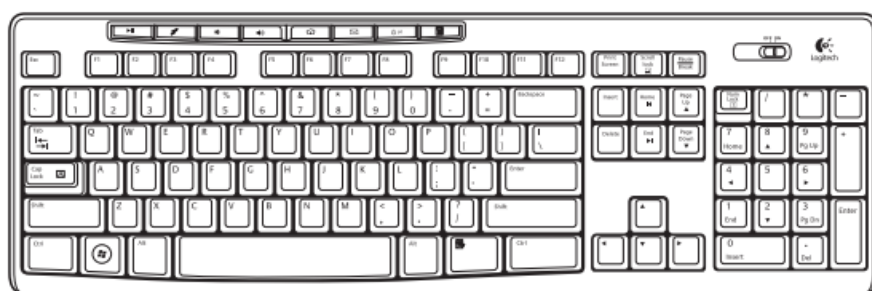
1. Ensure your Unifying receiver is plugged in.
2. Start the Unifying software by navigating to Start / All Programs / Logitech / Unifying / Logitech Unifying Software and follow the onscreen instructions to pair the new wireless device with your existing Unifying receiver.

Q: How many devices can I connect using Unifying?

A: You can connect up to six devices using Unifying, allowing you to build your ideal combo and use only one USB port for multiple devices.

Getting started is easy

If you're ready to pair your device(s) via Unifying, here's what you need to do:

1. Make sure your Unifying receiver is plugged in.
2. If you haven't already, download the Logitech® Unifying software from www.logitech.com/unifying.
3. Start the Unifying software* and follow the onscreen instructions to pair the new wireless device with your existing Unifying receiver.

Help with setup


- Is the keyboard powered on?
- Is the Unifying receiver securely plugged into a computer USB port? Try changing USB ports.
- If the Unifying receiver is plugged into a USB hub, try plugging it directly into a USB port on your computer.
- Did you pull the battery tab? Check the orientation of the batteries inside the keyboard, or replace the two AAA alkaline batteries.
- Remove metallic objects between the keyboard and its Unifying receiver.
- Try moving the Unifying receiver to a USB port closer to the keyboard, or go to www.logitech.com/usbextender for a USB extender that will allow the receiver to be placed closer to the keyboard.
- Try reconnecting the keyboard and Unifying receiver using the Logitech Unifying software (Refer to the Unifying section in this guide.)

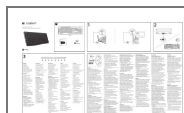
