

Rubber Strap Cutting Guide

Intro

What You'll Need:

- 1. Grael Rubber Watch Strap
- 2. Sharp Scissors or Craft Knife: A pair of sharp, sturdy scissors or a craft knife will help you make a clean cut
- 3. Ruler: For measuring the amount to cut
- 4. Marker or Pencil: To mark where to cut
- 5. Spring Bar Tool: To attach the strap back onto the watch after resizing

Step-by-Step Guide

1. Understand the Strap's Structure:

- Your rubber strap has multiple ridges or grooves that act as guides for cutting. Each groove is generally one segment, making it easier to cut evenly.
- Check the end of the strap that doesn't attach to the clasp; this is typically the side to trim.

2. Measure and Determine the Length:

- Wrap the strap around your wrist to get an estimate of the correct fit.
- Start by trimming a small amount, as you can always cut more if needed. Cutting too much can't be undone.

3. Mark Where to Cut:

- Use your ruler to measure the length to remove, and mark the cut line on the strap with a marker or pencil.
- Ensure both ends are marked evenly if you need to cut both sides of the strap. A balanced cut will help keep the watch centered on your wrist.

4. Make the Cut:

- Using your scissors or craft knife, carefully cut along the marked line.
- $\circ\;$ As your strap has pre-set grooves, cut along those for a cleaner result.
- Trim one segment at a time, then check the fit to avoid overcutting.

5. Test the Fit:

- After each cut, attach the strap back onto the watch and try it on your wrist to check the fit.
- If it's still loose, repeat the process by cutting one more segment and testing the fit again.

6. Reattach the Strap:

- Once you're satisfied with the length, use your spring bar tool to reattach the strap to the watch.
- Make sure it's securely in place, and do a final check for comfort and fit.

Tips for Success

- Cut a Little at a Time: It's better to go slowly and trim small amounts, checking the fit as you go.
- Follow the Grooves: Your strap has grooves, use them as guides to ensure straight cuts.
- Be Patient: Taking the time to measure and cut carefully will help avoid mistakes.
