## The following are the typical connection steps for a 2.4G battery

## mouse:

- 1. Confirm that the mouse has installed the battery and the battery is fully charged (some new mice may have insulation that needs to be removed in advance).
- 2. Find the 2.4G wireless receiver that comes with the mouse.

**Connection steps**:(Common scenarios such as PC connection)

- 1. Insert the 2.4G wireless receiver into the USB port of the computer. If the USB interface on the front panel of the computer is inconvenient to connect or the power supply is insufficient, you can try inserting it into the USB interface on the back panel of the computer.
- 2. Turn on the mouse power (if there is a separate power switch), some mice automatically turn on after inserting the receiver.
- 3. Wait a moment, usually the system will automatically recognize and install drivers (usually in mainstream system environments such as Windows)
