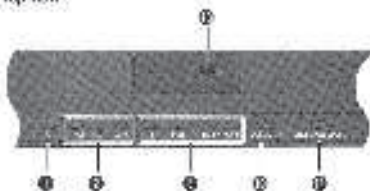

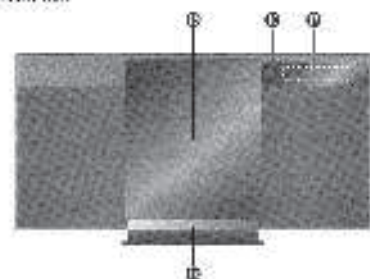
- 1 Standby/on switch (ON/OFF)
 - Press to switch the unit on or to standby from the power mode. If standby mode, the unit will be returning to normal operation.
- 2 Select sound source
- 3 Basic playback control
- 4 View the clock and sleep options
- 5 View the "SoftMute" (View Information)
- 6 Select the sound effects
- 7 Select the preset
- 8 Set the sleep timer
- 9 Decrease the brightness of the display panel
 - Press the button again to cancel.
- 10 Adjust the volume of the system
- 11 Mute the sound of the system
 - Press the button again to cancel.
 - NOTE: Lock is canceled when you adjust the volume or when you switch off the power.

Getting started

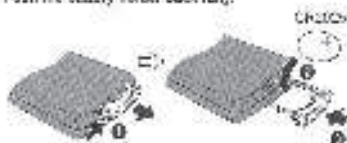

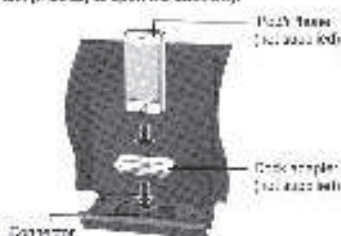

Radio

80 FM stations can be stored.

Preparation

Connect the FM cable antenna to the "Antenna" socket.

Press [RADIO].

Automatic presetting

- 1 Press [PLAY MENU] to select "A.PRESET".
- 2 Press [A, V] to select "LOWEST" or "CURRENT" frequency.
LOWEST : To begin presetting from the lowest frequency.
CURRENT : To begin presetting from the current frequency.
To change the frequency, select "Change" during the presetting.
- 3 Press [OK] to start presetting.
The tuner presets all the stations that were not already stored in a second order.
To cancel, press [III].

Manual tuning and presetting

- 1 Press [PLAY MENU] to select "TUNENODE".
- 2 Press [A, V] to select "MANUAL" and then press [OK].
- 3 Press [←•••••] or [•••••→] to tune in to the station.
To tune in, turn the A, V, and the B buttons, and the frequency auto-tuning begins. A "STEREO" is shown when the station is tuned in to a stereo broadcast.

To preset the station

- 4 Press [OK].
- 5 Press [A, V] to select a preset number.
- 6 Press [OK].
To delete 1 through 6, press the cancel menu button.

- To go back to the initial setting, do the above steps again.

Common problems

- No operating can be done with the remote control.

- Adjust the volume of the speaker.

Radio

Actual sound is heard.

- Switch off the FM receiver away from the system.

Station cannot be selected.

- Change the FM frequency step (see "FM station setting").

Main unit displays

"LOCK"

- You have not the AC power supply cord for the main unit and there are a power line nearby. Set the clock.

"ADJUST CLOCK"

- Clock is not set. Adjust the clock correctly.

"ADJUST TIMER"

- Play time is not set. Adjust the play timer accordingly.

"TIMER"

- 10 minutes after the set time is up, and 10 minutes after of the day up period is over.

"ERROR"

- An incorrect operation was done. Press the main unit and try again.

"BATT"

- The battery power supply is off.

- The iPod/iPhone is drawing too much power. Remove the iPod/iPhone. Switch the power off and on again.

"NO DEVICE"

- The iPod/iPhone is not connected. Examine the connection.

"NO DISC"

- You have not put the disc in.

"NO PLAY"

- You have put in a disc that the system cannot play.

"NOT SUPPORTED"

- The disc is not an iPod/iPhone disc, cannot be played.
- If the iPod/iPhone is compatible, connect the iPod/iPhone and connect it again. Examine that the battery of the iPod/iPhone is not depleted.

Memory reset (initialization)

Reset the memory when the following situations occur.

- The system is stopped when it is time are stopped.

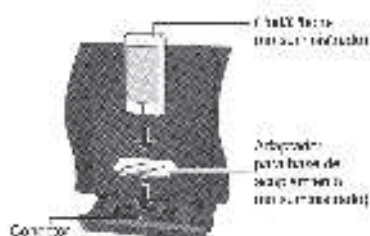
