SAFETY AND WARNINGS

Thank you for buying this Kogan product. Please read all safety instructions before using your TV.

WARNING

Never place a television set in an unstable location. A television set may fall, causing serious personal injury or death. Many injuries, particularly to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions such as:

- Using cabinets or stands recommended by the manufacturer of the television set.
- Only using furniture that can safely support the television set.
- Ensuring the television set is not overhanging the edge of the supporting furniture.
- Not placing the television set on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both the furniture and the television set to a suitable support.
- Not placing the television set on cloth or other materials that may be located between the television set and supporting furniture.
- Educating children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the television set or its controls.

If your existing television set is being retained and relocated, the same considerations as above should be applied.

- To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this apparatus to rain or moisture.






ASSEMBLY AND INSTALLATION


BEFORE YOU GET STARTED

Spread cushioning flat to lay the TV on. This will help to prevent damage.

1. Stand assembly


- **a.** Attach stands to base of TV
- **b.** Insert two 20mm screws for each stand and use Phillips head screwdriver (not supplied) to tighten.





2. Connect to antenna


- **a.** Connect an antenna cable (not supplied) via the 'ANT' input port at the back of the TV.
- **b.** Ensure the antenna cable is also connected to a working antenna, either via an antenna wall socket in your home, or directly.



USING REMOTE CONTROL / POWER BUTTON

3. Remote control assembly

- **a.** Open the battery compartment cover on the back side.
- **b.** Insert two 1.5V AAA size batteries, making sure to match the polarity markings (+ / -) of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.
- **c.** Replace battery compartment cover.




WARNINGS

- One loading of batteries will last for 1 year under normal use.
- If you do not intend to use the remote controller for a long period of time, remove them to avoid damage due to leakage.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Do not use old and new batteries together.
- The batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

4. Using remote control without bluetooth

Your Android TV remote control has bluetooth capability, but until this is paired with your TV, you will need to ensure the distance between the remote control and the TV is no greater than 8 metres, at an angle of no more that 30 degrees on either side **(4a)**. Point the remote towards the sensor at the front of the TV (this may differ from the illustration).




TIPS

Do not block the path between the sensor and the remote control.

5. Turning TV on

- **a.** Plug the power cord into a suitable power outlet. The standby will display a light, showing that the TV is receiving power.
- **b.** Press the POWER (Φ) button (either on your remote control or in the lower left corner of the rear panel on the TV) to turn the TV on.
- c. The standby light will turn off when the TV is on.




TURNING TV OFF

Press the POWER (4) button on the remote control to enter standby mode.

To power down the TV completely, unplug the power cord from the power outlet.

Do not leave your set in standby mode for long periods of time. If you will not use the TV for a long time, it is recommended to unplug the set from both the power outlet and aerial.

FIRST TIME SETUP


When turning the TV on for the first time, the **Welcome** screen will appear. Use the ^, ~ and **OK** buttons to navigate the following options.


Language and Location

You can press left/rigt button to select Language,Country,Time Zone and Tune Type. Press ENTER button to enter the Auto Tuning.Press MENU key to exit.

INPUT SOURCE

Press SOURCE to open the input source list, then press ▲/▼ to highlight an input and press OK to switch.








Following these options, the **Auto Tuning** screen will appear. Ensure you have an antenna cable connected to the 'ANT' input port at the back of the TV **(6a)**

The auto tuning function will search for and save all available free-to-air TV channels. After confirming your settings (the default will be set for Australia), the process will automatically begin. The number of searched channels will be displayed on the screen.



BASIC OPERATION

Selecting channels

There are two ways to select channel:

- 1. Using number buttons followed by the **OK** button on the remote control to select channel directly.
 - To select channel 5, press: **5**.
 - To select channel 21, press: **2 → 1** in quick succession.

When using the number buttons, you can directly select channels that were either not saved during the auto tuning, or manually erased.

2. Using +CH- buttons on the remote control or on your TV to select channel. When you press the +CH- buttons, the TV changes channels in sequence. You will see all the channels that the TV has saved, but will not see channels that were either not saved, or manually erased.

Volume adjustment and mute setup

Press **+VOL-** buttons on the remote control or the TV to adjust the volume of the TV.

- To increase the volume, press **VOL+** button
- To decrease the volume, press **VOL-** button

Press the $\[rac{1}{2} \]$ Mute button to toggle TV sound on and off. The mute icon will appear in the lower-right corner of the screen. To resume sound when TV is muted, press the $\[rac{1}{2} \]$ Mute button again, or simply press the VOL+ button

Input source

Input options are accessible directly from the screen by selecting the **SOURCE** icon. Press the **ENTER** button to confirm your selection.

Colour buttons

In some menus and apps, the remote control's four colour buttons (••••) can be used.

Navigating menus

- · Press the **MENU** button to display the quick menu.
- Press the ^/~ Navigational buttons to select the desired sub item.
- Press the Enter or > Navigational button to access the menu of the next level.
- · Select **More** on quick menu list to bring up the full settings menu.
- Press the **EXIT** button to return to the previous menu.

NOTE

- When a menu item is greyed out, it means that the item is not available or cannot be adjusted.
- Some items in menus may be hidden depending on modes or signal sources used.

You can select the type of picture, which best corresponds to your viewing. Press "MENU" button to enter the OSD menu. Then press "◀/▶" button to select the "**PICTURE**" menu.



1.Press " ▲/▼ " button to select "Picture Mode" and press the " ◀/▶ " button to select mode.

2.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Contrast" and press the "◀/▶" button to enter contrast adjustment menu to adjust contrast.

3.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Brightness" and press the "◀/▶"

button to enter Brightness adjustment menu to adjust Brightness.

4.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Colour" and press the "◀/▶" button to enter colour adjustment menu to adjust colour.

5.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Sharpness" and press the "◀/▶"

button to enter sharpness adjustment menu to adjust sharpness.

6.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Tint" and press the "∢/▶" button to enter tint adjustment menu to adjust tint.

Note: The 'hue' item is used in NTSC mode only.

7.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Color Temp" and press the "∢/▶" button to select mode: Normal,Cold,Warm.


8.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Noise Reduction" and press the "◀/▶" button to select.

9.Press " $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ " button to select "HDMI Mode" and press the " $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$ " button to select.

10.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Backlight" and press the "◀/▶" button to enter contrast adjustment menu to adjust contrast.

SOUND

You can select the type of sound, which best corresponds to your viewing. Press "MENU" button to enter the OSD menu. Then press "◀/▶" button to select the "SOUND" menu.



1.Press " ▲/▼ " button to select "Sound Mode" and press the " ◀/▶" button to select mode.

2.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Treble" and press the "◀/▶" button to adjust.

3.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Bass" and press the "◀/▶" button to adjust.

4.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Balance" and press the "ENTER" button to adjust.

5.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Auto Volume Level" press the "ENTER" button to adjust.

6.Press "▲/▼" button to select "SPDIF Mode" and press the "ENTER" button to adjust.

7.Press "▲/▼" button to select "AD Switch" and press "ENTER" button to adjust.

Press "MENU" button to enter the OSD menu. Then press "◀/▶" button to select the "TIME" menu.

Press "MENU" button to enter the OSD menu. Then press " $\triangleleft/\triangleright$ " button to select the "LOCK" menu.

2.Press " $^{/}$ " button to select "Set Password" and set your new password. 3.Press " $^{/}$ " button to select "Channel Locks" and press the "GREEN" button to set.

4.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Parental Guidance" and press the "GREEN" button to set.

5.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Key Lock" and press "◄/▶" button to slect "On" or "Off", the key board will be invalid if you set Key Lockpad "on".



4.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Subtitle Language" and press the "▶" button to enter the subtitle language adjustment menu to select the subtitle language which you desire.

5. Press "▲/▼" button to select "Hearing Impaired" and press "◄/▶" button to slect "On" or "Off".

6.Press "▲/▼" button to select "PVR File System".

7.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Aspect Ratio" and press "◄/▶" button to select to select aspect

8.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Blue Screen" and press "◄/▶" button to slect "On" or "Off".

9.Press "▲/▼" button to select "First Time Installation" and press the "ENTER" button to enter.

10.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Reset" and press the "ENTER" a dialogue. Press "∢"button selecting "Yes" to restore all setting to default setting.

11.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Software Update" and press the "ENTER" button to update software using USB.

Note: It is only use for service

12.Press "▲/▼" button to select "Environment" and press the "∢/▶" button to select "Home Mode" or "Shop Mode"

13. Press "▲/▼" button to select "HDMI CEC".

PVR MODE

NOTE

- Don't connect or disconnect any USB device while in USB playback mode.
- Ensure all personal data is backed up before inserting USB device into TV. We assume no liability for any loss of data due to malfunction or misuse.
- USB device should have capacity at least 512MB.
- USB device must support USB 2.0 high-speed specification.
- Use only USB storage devices formatted to FAT32.
- · You cannot change channels while recording.
- If the signal is interrupted while recording, the recording will stop until signal is regained.
- · While in time-shift mode, do not turn TV off.
- The U disk will be formatted when in format, please do not store important files in the U disk.
- Press "o"button for the first time to start recording, for the second time, the sign of recorder will be slimmed sown, but it's still under recording.

Setup

In DTV source, press the "NENU" button to enter the OSD menu. Then press " \triangleleft / \triangleright " button select the "Setup" menu.



Press " $_{A/V}$ " button to select "PVR File System" and press the "ENTER" button to enter.

Press "▲/▼" button to select "Check PVR File System"and press the "ENTER" button to enter.

Recording

There are two types of recording: **Instant Recording** and **Schedule Recording**. Instant recording can record current TV programmes, while schedule recording can be set to record TV programmes automatically on the day, time, and duration you choose.

Instant recording

Select the channel you want, then press the ● **Record** button on the remote control to start recording. You will be prompted to confirm – press **OK** to begin recording.

To hide the information bar at the bottom of the screen, press the • **Record** button once more.

To stop the recording, press **Stop** and then **OK** to confirm when prompted.

Schedule recording

Select the **Schedule List** from the Record menu. Use the navigation buttons to select the desired programme, and press the **Red** colour button to schedule a programme for recording.

You can schedule several items to record. Press the
• Yellow colour button to view the list of currently scheduled programmes. Different schedules should not overlap and there must be at least a one-minute time gap to set up between two schedules.

NOTE

Schedule recording still works when TV is in standby mode.



PVR MODE (cont'd)

Timeshift mode

With the Timeshift turned on, you may pause and rewind normal TV viewing at any time without missing any of the live broadcast. This can also allow you to create a buffer and skip forward through commercials.

Press the **II Pause** button on the remote control while in DTV mode to activate the Timeshift function. The TV stores the channel from the point of view you want to record. ▶ **Play** will resume from where you left off. Press ■ **Stop** to exit Timeshift mode. If a USB device dedicated to recording is disconnected, Timeshift files that were saved will automatically be deleted.

Playing recorded files

After recording is complete, press the **Menu** button on your remote control, then the ▼ button to scroll down to the **Record** menu to find the **Record List**. Here you will find a complete list of your recordings. Press the • **Red** colour button to delete any files you no longer require.

MEDIA PLAYBACK

To access media playback mode, insert a USB drive containing files of the following type into the TV's USB input port. Next, from the Home page, select your preferred media player app. The following file types are supported:

Alongside flashdrives, the TV's USB port is also capable of reading from devices such as digital cameras and USB hard disks.

Recordings saved in PVR mode will also be playable.

Using discs

Handling

When inserting or removing a disc, do not touch the surface



Cleaning

Fingerprints and other contaminations can reduce the qualit of the sound and the video. Use a soft, clean cloth for cleaning that can be moistened with a neutral, diluted cleaning agent if the disc is very contaminated.



Do not wipe in circular motion (risk of static noises); instead, always wipe from the centre of the disc toward the outer edge (see illstration).





Note on storage

Do not expose the discs to direct sunlight or high temperatures.

CAREFULLY READ THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE TURNING ON THE DVD PLAYER FOR THE FIRST TIME.

Playback operation Getting started

1	Connect the device to a mains socket using the power supply unit that is delivered with the device.
2	Push the POWER key on the right side of the TV SET.
3	Switch to DVD Mode and insert a DVD with the Label facing backwards. TheDVD player automatically starts with the playback.

NOTE:

An inserted DVD can only be ejected in DVD Mode. The Eject key has no function in other modes.

Please pay attention to insert the DVD in the right way, the label should show to the backside!

Operating the device and general buttons

Depending on the situation, you can use the buttons on the device or remote control to operate the device. However, the remote control enables greater usage of the device functions.

ASPECT button: The aspect ration toggles between 16:9 and 4:3.

ZOOM button:(remote control):For DVDs the image size is successively changed to the following values compared to the normal size:2x.3x. 4xThis function is not available for CDs.

A-B button:(remote control):Enables you to repeat playback of the section between points A and B multiple times while a disc is playing.Press this button once to set point A.Press the button a second time to set point B and start the looped playback.

When you press this button during looped playback, you exitthe loop mode.

This function is not available for JPEG discs.

DVD playback

TROUBLESHOOTING

Common fixes

Many minor issues can be resolved by hard resetting, or power cycling the unit or upgrading the firmware.

To perform a hard reset, or power cycle, · Select the picture menu, then adjust please use the following steps.

- Unplug it from the main power socket and leave it for 10-15 minutes.
- Press and hold the power button on the TV for 5 seconds.
- Connect the TV back to the power and turn it on.

Poor picture and sound quality

- Try a different channel
- · Adjust the antenna
- · Check all connections

No picture or sound in TV status

- Try another channel
- Press the TV/AV button
- · Make sure TV is plugged in
- Check the antenna connection

No sound or sound is too low at maximum volume

- · Check the volume settings on any external speakers connected to your television
- · Adjust the TV volume accordingly
- · Check another channel or input
- Check that MUTF hasn't been turned. on

Picture rolls vertically

· Check all connections

No colour, wrong colour or tints

- · Make sure the program itself is broadcast in colour
- the colour and tint submenus

Blurred or snowy picture, distorted sound

- · Check direction, location and connections to your antenna
- Issues may be caused by the use of an indoor antenna (poor signal)

Remote control malfunctions

- Replace remote control batteries
- · Check battery terminals
- · Remote is out of range, move closer to
- · Remove any obstructions between remote and IR sensor of TV
- · Make sure the power cord to your TV is plugged in and turned on

Image is not centred on the screen

 Adjust the horizontal and vertical position

"No Signal" on HDMI source

- Test the device with a different HDMI. cable
- Plug the device into another HDMI
- · Try a different device connected to the same cable and port
- Perform a factory reset on your TV

Care & maintenance

Unplug the television from the power supply before cleaning. Do not use any liquid cleaners or harsh chemicals. Always use a soft, damp cloth.

Cleaning the screen

Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.

Make sure the excess water is off the screen. and then let it air-dry before you turn on your

Cleaning the casing

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the TV casing with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.
