### ENGINE START/STOP BUTTON

With the ignition OFF, press the engine start/stop button:

- Once for ACC (Accessory) mode.
- Twice for ON mode.
- Three times for OFF.



To start the engine, press the start/stop button while:

- Automatic Transmission: depressing the brake pedal.
- Manual Transmission: depressing the clutch and brake pedals.

To shut engine OFF, shift to:

- Automatic Transmission: P (Park) and press the start/stop button.
- Manual Transmission: Select 1st gear or Neutral, apply the parking brake, and press the start/stop button.

### BLUETOOTH OPERATIONAL TIPS

In the following situations you or the other party may have difficulty hearing each other:

1. When the Bluetooth volume is at a high level. Keep the Bluetooth volume to a low level to reduce distortion and echo.
2. When driving on a rough road, high speeds and/or with the window open.
3. When the air conditioning vents are facing the microphone and/or when the air conditioning fan is at the max speed.

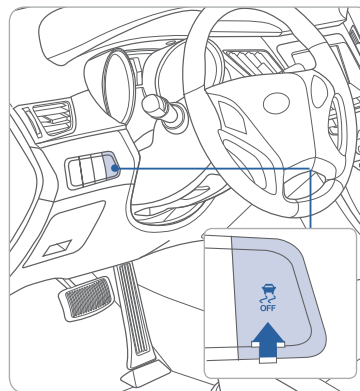
### TPMS Malfunction Indicator

Tire pressure may vary in colder temperatures causing the low tire pressure light (!) to illuminate.

## ELECTRONIC STABILITY CONTROL (ESC)

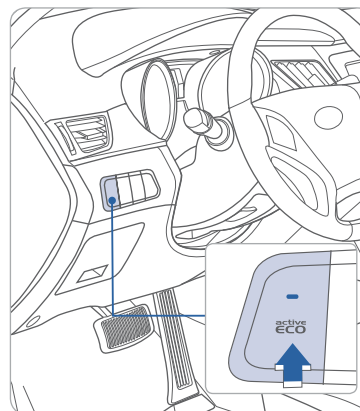


The ESC system is an electronic system designed to help the driver maintain vehicle control under adverse conditions.

- To turn the ESC off, press the button. Indicator will illuminate on the instrument cluster.
- To turn ESC on, press it again.
- System defaults to ON position at start.



## ACTIVE ECO SYSTEM



### Active ECO system (automatic transmission)

Active ECO system helps to improve fuel efficiency. When the Active ECO system is activated, the vehicle acceleration, gear shift points and air conditioning performance will be reduced to conserve the fuel consumption.

Press the Active ECO button to activate. The LED on the button and the ECO indicator in the instrument cluster will illuminate.

### ECO Shift (Manual Transmission)

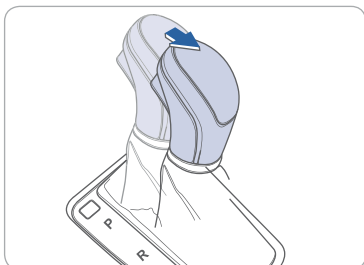

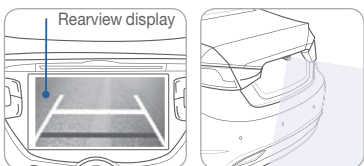
### To improve your fuel efficiency:

- Adjust the vehicle speed to the traffic condition and avoid speed changes.
- Avoid unnecessary braking.
- Keep the tires inflated to the recommended tire pressure.
- Don't idle the engine longer than necessary.

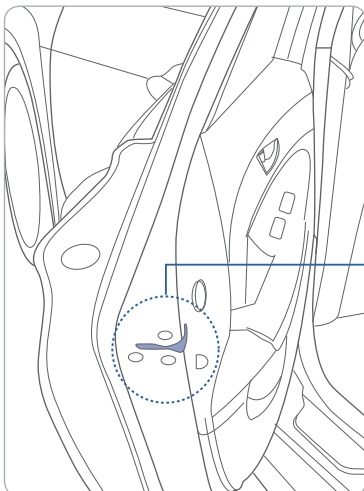

## TIRE MOBILITY KIT



### Setup

1. Remove the speed restriction label from the sealant bottle and place it on the center of the steering wheel.
2. Ensure that the compressor is switched to OFF.
3. Lift the cable cover ① and screw the compressor hose ② on to the connector of the sealant bottle.
4. Insert the sealant bottle into the housing slot ③ of the compressor.
5. Screw the filling hose ④ of the sealant bottle onto the tire's valve stem.
6. Insert the compressor power plug ⑤ into the vehicle's power outlet.
7. Turn the ignition switch to the ON position or press the Engine Start/Stop button twice.



### Inflate Tire

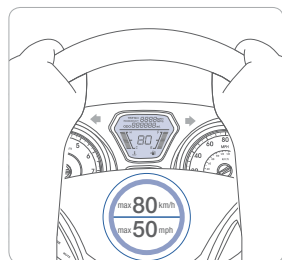
1. Switch ON the compressor and let it run for approximately 5 minutes.
2. Switch OFF the compressor and check to ensure that inflation pressure is over 32 psi. If not, the puncture is too large to repair. Contact Hyundai Roadside Assistance.
3. Remove the filling hose ④, compressor hose ②, and compressor power plug ⑤.

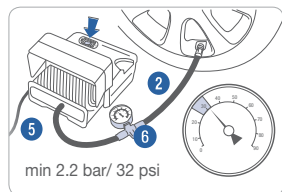

#### Drive Vehicle

1. Drive for approximately 6 miles or 10 minutes no faster than 50 mph.



#### Recheck Tire Pressure

1. Screw the compressor hose **2** directly to the tire valve.
2. Insert the compressor power plug **5** into the vehicle's power outlet.
3. Adjust to the recommended tire pressure located on the driver side door jam placard.

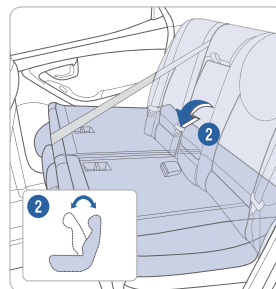
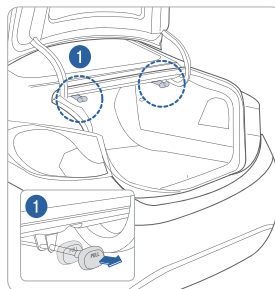
