

Video support

Microsoft has a lot of video support for programming on their web site.

There is an [introductory video](#) on installation and many Visual C# 2008 features, including debugging and database access.

There is also a series of video lessons on C# programming. They are tiered (1 to 3) and videos are available for everyone from beginners (starting with bits and bytes) to advanced programmers.

The videos to support C# are for Visual Studio 2005, but many of the ideas are the same as the 2008 version covered by the book.
