Important Health and Safety Information

When using this product, the safety precautions below must be taken to avoid possible legal liabilities and damages. Retain and follow all product safety and operating instructions.

Observe all warnings in the product operating instructions. To reduce the risk of bodily injury, electric shock, fire, and damage to the equipment, closely observe all of the following precautions.

Safety Precautions for Proper Grounding Installation

Caution: Connecting to improperly grounded equipment can result in an electric shock to either you or your device. This product is equipped with a USB Cable for connecting to a desktop or notebook computer. Be sure your computer is properly grounded before connecting this product to the computer. The power supply cord of a desktop or notebook computer has an equipment-grounding conductor and a grounding plug. The grounding plug must be plugged into an appropriate outlet that is properly installed and grounded by all local codes and ordinances.

Safety Precautions for Power Supply Unit

The product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the electrical rating label. If you are unsure of the type of power source required, consult your authorized service provider or local power company. For a product that operates from battery power or other sources, refer to the operating instructions included with the product.

Electrical Safety

This product is intended for use when supplied with power from the designated battery or power supply unit. Other usages may be dangerous and will invalidate any approval given to this product.

Handle battery packs carefully. This product contains a Li-ion battery.

There is a risk of fire and burns if the battery pack is handled improperly. Do not attempt to open or service the battery pack. Do not disassemble, crush, puncture, short external contacts or circuits, dispose of in fire or water, or expose a battery pack to temperatures higher than 55°C (131°F).

Note: Danger of explosion if the battery is incorrectly replaced. Recycle or dispose of used batteries according to all applicable local regulations, or by the instructions in the reference guide.

Follow these other specific precautions:

Do not use a battery that appears damaged, deformed, discolored, has any rust on its casing, if it overheats, and/or if it emits a foul odor.

Prevention of Hearing Loss

Safety Precautions for Direct Sunlight

Store this product away from excessive moisture and extreme temperatures. Do not leave the product or its battery inside a vehicle or in places where the temperature may exceed 55°C (131°F), such as on a car dashboard, window sill, or behind glass that is exposed to direct sunlight or strong ultraviolet light for extended periods. This may damage the product, overheat the battery, or pose a risk to the vehicle.

Environmental Restrictions

Do not use this product in gas stations, fuel depots, chemical plants or where blasting operations are in progress, or potentially explosive atmospheres such as fueling areas, fuel storehouses, below deck on boats, chemical plants, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders. Danger!

Do not put or store cells together with metal articles such as necklaces, hairpins, coins, or screws.

Do not short-circuit the (+) and (-) terminals with metal conductors.

Do not place a cell in a device with the (+) and (-) in a reverse way.

Do not penetrate cells with a sharp article such as a needle.

Do not disassemble the cell.

Do not weld the cell directly.

Do not use a seriously damaged or deformed cell.

Thoroughly read the user's guide before use, Inaccurate handling of lithium-ion cells may result in heat, fire, explosion, damage, or the capacity loss of the cell.

Warning!

Do not put the cell into a heating vessel, washing machine, or high-pressure container.

SIM/SD Card

The SIM card is an IC card containing a phone number and other customer information.

Your phone supports the use of an optional Micro SD card (sold separately) to expand its storage capacity up to 128GB. Some SD cards may not operate properly with your phone.

SIM Card Cautions

Keep the following in mind when handling a SIM card.

- You are responsible for any damage caused by inserting the SIM card in another-brand IC card reader, etc. Your carrier is not responsible in such a case.
- Always keep the IC chip clean.
- Wipe clean with a dry, soft cloth.
- Avoid applying labels as they may damage the SIM card.
- See instructions included with SIM card for handling.
- Always power off the phone before inserting or removing the SIM card.

SD Card Cautions

Data: Information stored on an SD card can become lost or changed accidentally or as a result of damage. It is recommended that you keep a separate copy of important data. Your carrier is not responsible for damages from data that is lost or changed.

Reading/Writing Data: Never power off while reading or writing data. A low battery charge may prevent reading/writing to an SD card.

Handling SD Cards: Use/store SD cards away from the reach of infants. They may cause choking if swallowed.

Install the SIM/SD Card


Follow these instructions to insert the SIM/SD card. Remember to power off your phone before inserting a SIM/SD card.

Remove the back cover.

With the phone facing down, locate the notch on the bottom left edge of your phone. Try to pry it up and away from your phone with a plastic card or your fingernail until it's completely removed.



- 2. Locate the SIM card slot and the SD card slot.
- 3. Slide the SIM card into the SIM card slot with the gold contacts facing down. If you have an SD card (sold separately), slide it into the SD card slot.



- 4. Install the back cover.
- 5. Align the back cover to the frame of the phone and apply it until it locks into place.



Enter the SD Card

IRIS Easy Flip supports up to 128GB SD card, when you insert an optional SD card, you can view the folders by pressing the **Left Navigation Key** and selecting the SD card to view the folders.

Battery

Battery Cautions

Storage: Avoid storing or leaving the battery with no charge remaining. Saved information and settings may become lost or changed, or the battery may become unusable. Charge once every six months when storing or leaving unused for a long period.

Charge the Battery

Follow these instructions to charge your phone's battery using the included AC adapter.

- 1. Connect the USB-C end of the data cable to the USB-C port on your phone.
- 2. Connect another end to the travel adapter.
- 3. Connect the travel adapter to an electrical outlet to start charging your phone.
- 4. After charging is finished, disconnect the phone from the charger and unplug the travel adapter from the outlet.

Attention: Use of unauthorized accessories could damage your phone and void your warranty.

Power On and Off


Power Your Phone On

Press and hold the **Power Key** to power the phone on.

Power Your Phone Off

1. Press and hold the **Power Key** until the menu pops up.




2. Select Power off.

Initial Setup

The tutorials screens help you set up certain features and preferences on your phone. When your phone has been turned on for the first time, you will need to follow these instructions to complete the setup process.

1. Choose a language and select **Next** to get started.





- 2. Select a Wi-Fi and enter the password if you want to connect to the Wi-Fi. For secured Wi-Fi networks, you will need to enter a password. See Wi-Fi for more details.
- 3. There is a list of Accessibility features for you to choose from. If you are visually impaired or hard of hearing, choose the relevant function to change the accessibility settings.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete each section. For each topic, you will have the option to skip it and continue to the next screen. If you skipped any part of the setup, you can access additional options at a later time in the Settings menu.


Basic Operations

The following topics offer an overview of your phone's basic operations.

Enter Text

Keyboards

Press the **OK Key** to show the input program, and then use the keypad to enter text. There are several input methods to choose from, when in a text field, press the **Left Soft Key** to choose between different input methods.



Lock and Unlock Your Screen

Your phone allows you to quickly turn the screen off when not in use and to turn it back on and unlock it when you need it.

Turn the Screen Off When Not in Use

To quickly turn the main screen off, simply flip the phone cover to the closed position.

To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after a certain period when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone's screen is off.

Note: For information on how to adjust the time before the screen turns off, see Display.

Turn the Screen On and Unlock It

1. To turn the screen on, simply flip the phone open if the cover is closed, if the cover is already open, press any key to unlock the phone.

- The lock screen appears if password protection is set.
- 2. Enter the 4-digit password.
 - The screen is unlocked.

Note: See more on Screen Lock.

Capture Screenshots

You can use your phone's **Power Key** and **Lower Volume Key** to capture screenshots.

- Press and hold the Power Key and Lower Volume Key at the same time to capture a screenshot of the current screen.
 - The current screenshot will be captured and stored in the phone's Gallery. From the home screen, press OK to enter the Apps List and then select Gallery.

Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus.







Notifications panel

Select and assign your phone's background wallpaper.

- 1. From the home screen press OK > Settings > Display > Wallpaper > Wallpaper
- 2. Press **OK** to set the wallpaper.

You can also select a wallpaper from your Gallery.

- 1. From the home screen press **OK** > **Settings** > **Display** > **Wallpaper** > **Gallery**
- 2. Choose a picture and select View, then select Save


Transfer Files between Your Phone and a Computer

You can use the supplied USB cable to connect your phone directly to your computer and transfer music, photos, and other content files.

- If you want to save data to an SD card on your phone, make sure the SD card is installed and active. See SIM/SD Card.
- Avoid removing the SD card while transferring data.

Transfer Files between the Phone and a Computer

- 1. Connect your phone to your computer using the supplied USB/charging cable.
 - Insert the USB-C end of the cable to the phone.
 - Insert the other end of the cable into a USB port on your computer.
- From the home screen, press OK to enter Apps List, then go to Settings > Phone settings > USB, then select Transfer files



3. On your computer, navigate to the detected device (such as through the My Computer menu) and open it.

Select

- 4. If available, select a drive (SD card or internal shared storage).
- 5. Select a folder (for example, **Music** for songs and albums) and copy files to it from your computer.
- 6. When you are done, disconnect your phone from your computer.
 - The transferred files are now saved to your phone or SD card.

Update Your Phone

From time to time, updates may become available for your phone.

Software Update Cautions

During update: The phone cannot be used until the software update is complete. It may take time to update your phone's software.

Signal during update: Update your phone where signal reception is good, and do not change location during the update process. Make sure the battery is adequately charged before beginning an update. A weak signal or low battery during an update may cause the update to fail. An update failure may disable the phone.

Other functions during update: Other phone functions cannot be used during a software update.

Back-Up All Data Before Update


Updating your phone may result in a loss of saved data depending on the condition of your phone (malfunctioning, damaged, water seepage, etc.). You must back up all critical information before updating your phone firmware.

Follow these steps to back up your files like photos from your phone to the SD card: from the menu screen select Tools - File Manager - Phone - DCIM - Camera - Options - Select file - Select all - Options - Copy - Press Return Key back to "File Manager" screen - select SD card - Select a designated file - Paste.

For Contacts, you can back up them to the SIM card. From the menu screen, select **Contacts – select a contact – Options – Settings – Export contacts to SIM – Select.**

Update Your Phone's Software

- 1. Press **OK** to enter the **Apps List** and then select **Settings** > **Software update**.
- 2. There will be options to update if an update is available.



Apps and Features

The following topics outline essential apps and features of your phone.

Connectivity

The following topics address your phone's connectivity options including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and more.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless internet access over distances. To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point.

The availability and range of the Wi-Fi signal depend on several factors, including infrastructure and other objects through which the signal passes.

Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wireless Network

- 1. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter the **Apps List**, then select **Settings**.
- 2. Select Wireless & network > Wi-Fi.
 - The Wi-Fi settings menu appears.
- 3. Press the Left Soft Key to turn the Wi-Fi on.



- Wi-Fi is enabled. You will see the names and security settings of in-range Wi-Fi networks.
 - To disable Wi-Fi, press the Left Soft Key again.
- 4. Press **OK** to select a Wi-Fi network to connect, enter the password (if it's not an open network), and then press **OK** to **Connect**.
 - Your phone is connected to the Wi-Fi network. You will see the wifi icon in the status bar.

Tips:

- The password, for a household wireless LAN router, is sometimes found on a sticker on the router (WEP, WPA, KEY, etc.). Contact the router manufacturer for information. For a password for a public wireless LAN, check with the user's service provider.
- Entering a password is not required if an access point is not security protected.
- The next time your phone connects to a previously accessed secured wireless network, you will not
 be prompted to enter the password again, unless you reset your phone to its factory default settings,
 or you instruct the phone to forget the network.
- Wi-Fi networks are self-discoverable, which means no additional steps are required for your phone
 to connect to a Wi-Fi network. It may be necessary to provide a username and password for certain
 closed wireless networks.
- To receive notifications when a high-quality public network is available, on the Wi-Fi settings menu, select **Options > Advanced Wi-Fi > Wi-Fi notification > On**

Forget or Disconnect Wi-Fi

You may wish to disconnect from a connected Wi-Fi network without turning the Wi-Fi off.

- From the home screen, press OK to enter the Apps List, then go to Settings > Wireless & network > Wi-Fi
 - The Wi-Fi settings menu appears.
- 2. Select Turn Off.
 - Wi-Fi is disconnected.

If you wish to forget a Wi-Fi.

- From the home screen, press OK to enter the Apps List, then go to Settings > Wireless & network > Wi-Fi
 - The Wi-Fi settings menu appears.
- 2. Choose the Wi-Fi name and select **Options** > **Forget**.
 - Wi-Fi is disconnected and forgotten.
 - If you Forget or Disconnect, you may not need to re-enter the password to reconnect.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth® is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to Bluetooth devices, such as headsets with hands-free car kits, Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is approximately 30 feet. Your phone supports Bluetooth 4.2.

Bluetooth Cautions

- Information may not appear correctly on connected devices depending on the transferred data.
- Wireless connection to all Bluetooth® functions is not guaranteed for the phone.
- The phone may not connect properly depending on the other device.
- Noise may be experienced with wireless calls and hands-free calls depending on the conditions.

Bluetooth Information

Bluetooth is a technology that enables wireless connection with PCs, Bluetooth devices with hands-free features, etc.


Function	Description
Audio output	Listen to music and other media wirelessly.
Hands-free calls	Call using Bluetooth-capable hands-free devices and headsets.
Data exchange	Exchange data with Bluetooth devices.

Enable the Bluetooth Feature

Use the settings menu to enable or disable your phone's Bluetooth capabilities.

To enable Bluetooth, complete the following steps:

- From the home screen, press OK to enter the Apps List, then select Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth
 - The Bluetooth settings menu will open.



2. Press the **Left Soft Key** to turn Bluetooth on.

- Bluetooth is enabled.
 - To disable Bluetooth, Press the Left Soft Key again.

Tips:


- You can also turn Bluetooth on or off in the Shortcut panel. Press the Right Navigation Key to enter the Shortcut panel and then select Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth on or off.
- Turn off Bluetooth when not in use to conserve battery power, or in places where using a wireless phone is prohibited, such as on an aircraft and in hospitals.

Pair Bluetooth Devices

Search for and pair nearby Bluetooth devices. Registered Bluetooth® devices can be connected simply.

To pair Bluetooth devices, complete the following steps:

- 1. Enable the Bluetooth function on the Bluetooth devices being paired beforehand.
- 2. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter the **Apps List**.
- 3. Select Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth
 - The Bluetooth settings menu will open.
- 4. Select ON to enable Bluetooth
 - Nearby devices appear in the "Available devices" list.



- 5. Select a device from the "Available devices" list and follow the onscreen instructions to pair it with the device.
 - The Bluetooth device is paired to your phone.

Note: Methods to accept a Bluetooth connection differ depending on the devices used.

Unpair from a Paired Device

1. From the "Paired devices" menu, select the paired device.



- 2. Press OK to disconnect.
 - The device is unpaired from your phone. To make another connection with the device, you will need to pair again.

Connect to a Paired Bluetooth Device

You can pair with a previously paired Bluetooth device without re-entering the password.

Note: The device may automatically connect to a previously paired device when the Bluetooth is ON.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer, or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth-compatible devices.

Send Information Using Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer information between your phone and another Bluetooth-enabled device such as a phone or notebook computer.

Types of Data You Can Send via Bluetooth


You can send the following types of information, depending on the device you are sending to:

- Images and videos
- Calendar events
- Contacts
- Audio files


In the instructions below, Contacts data is being used as an example.

Sending Contacts Data via Bluetooth

1. From the home screen, press **OK Key** to enter the **Apps List**.



2. Select Contact > Find the contact you want to share > Options > Share > Bluetooth.



- 3. Select a paired device to receive the data.
 - The contact information is sent.
 - If you see a message to confirm, follow the onscreen instructions.

Receive Information via Bluetooth

Your phone is capable of receiving a wide variety of file types with Bluetooth, including photos, music tracks, and documents such as PDFs.

1. When another device attempts to send a file to your phone via Bluetooth, you will see a request to accept the file.

2. Select ACCEPT.

- The file is sent to your phone.
 - When your phone receives a file, you will see a notification. To open the file immediately, select Notifications to display the notifications panel, and then select the notification.
 - When you open a received file, what happens next depends on the file type:
 - Media files and documents are usually opened directly in a compatible application. For example, if you open a music track, it starts playing in the Music application.
 - For a vCard contact file, if there are multiple vCard files on your storage card, you can choose to import one, several, or all of those contacts to your contacts list.


Make and Answer Calls

The following topics describe how to directly dial calls, how to answer incoming calls, and how to use the in-call screen options

Call Using the Keypad

The most common way to place a call is by using the phone's keypad.

- 1. From the home screen, simply dial the number.
 - As you enter digits, Smart Dial searches for contacts that match. If you see the number you
 want to dial, select it to place the call immediately without entering the rest of the number.



- 2. Press the Call Key to place the call.
 - The phone dials the number. The call begins when the other party answers.
 - Adjust In-Call Volume: Press the Volume Key up or down during the call.
- 3. To end the call, press the **Power Key**.
 - The call ends.

Call Emergency Numbers

If your phone has network coverage, you can make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code. You can also place calls to 9-1-1 even if the phone's screen is locked or your account is restricted. Emergency calls are not restricted in Airplane mode.

To call the 9-1-1 emergency number when the phone's screen is locked with a screen lock:

- 1. From the lock screen, press the **Left Soft Key** to select **Emergency**.
- 2. Dial 911 and press the Call Key.
 - ❖ As long as you are in an area covered by wireless service, the emergency call is placed.

To call the 9-1-1 emergency number normally or when your account is restricted:

- 1. Unlock the screen.
- 2. From the home screen, dial 911 and press the Call Key.
 - As long as you are in an area covered by wireless service, the emergency call is placed.

Although all devices are equipped with 9-1-1 emergency calls, this device may or may not permit its location to be approximated during a 9-1-1 call.*


Note:

* Availability of this feature depends on upgrades to the (a) wireless network and (b) 9-1-1 calling system that is required to be installed by the local 9-1-1 response agency or public safety answering point (PSAP); these upgrades may not be available everywhere within our wireless coverage area or your roaming area. This approximation of the device's location and the transmittal of location information are subject to emergencies, transmission limits, network problems/limitations, interconnecting carrier problems, your device, buildings/tunnels, signal strength, and atmospheric/topographical conditions, and may be curtailed, interrupted, dropped or refused. Call from Contacts

You can place phone calls directly from entries in your Contacts list.

- 1. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter the **Apps List.**
- 2. Select **Contacts** to display the Contacts list.
 - The contacts list appears.




- 3. Select a contact and press the Call Key to place the call.
 - ❖ The phone dials the number. The call begins when the other party answers.
- 4. To end the call, press the **Power Key**.
 - The call ends.

Call from Call Log

The call log list lets you quickly place calls to recent incoming, outgoing, or missed numbers.

- 1. From the home screen, press the **Call Key** to display the recent call screen.
 - The call log list appears.



- 2. Press the Call Key to place the call.
 - The phone dials the number. The call begins when the other party answers.
- 3. To end the call, press the **Power Key**.
 - The call ends.


Answer Phone Calls

The following information shows you how to answer incoming calls, mute the ringer on incoming calls, reject incoming calls, and more.

When you receive a phone call from a contact, the incoming call screen appears and displays the caller name and phone number. When you receive a phone call from someone who is not stored in the Contacts, only the phone number appears on the Incoming call screen.

Answer an Incoming Call

- 1. When a call arrives, press the Call Key or OK Key to answer it.
 - The call begins.



- 2. To end the call, press the **Power Key**.
 - The call ends.

Mute the Ringing Sound

To mute the ringer without rejecting the call:

- Press the Volume Down Key.
- Press the Right Navigation Key to ignore the call.

Reject an Incoming Call

When a call arrives, press the Power Key to reject it.


Reject a Call and Send a Text Message

You can reject an incoming call and automatically send a text message to the caller.

- 1. When a call arrives, press the **Left Navigation Key** to send the message.
 - The ringtone or vibration will stop and you will see a list of preset text messages.
- 2. Select one of the messages to send to the caller.
 - The selected message will be delivered to the caller.
 - You can edit the reject messages through the Call settings menu. From the home screen, press OK
 to enter the Apps List, then go to Settings > Call settings > Ignore with a message and edit the
 reject messages.

In-Call Screen Layout and Operations

While you're on a call, you will see several onscreen options.



Options to activate during a call:

- Hold call: Select to hold the call.
- Add call: Select and hold to initiate a conference call (3-way call).
- Mute: Mute the microphone during an active call. Select again to unmute the microphone.

Voicemail

The following topics describe how to set up and use your phone's voicemail and visual voicemail features.

Voicemail Setup

Follow the instructions below to set up voicemail on your phone. You should set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Always use a passcode to protect against unauthorized access. Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. You can set up voicemail via **Settings > Call settings > Voice mail**.


- 1. From the home screen, press 1 and hold to dial your voicemail number.
 - Your phone dials the voicemail access number
- 2. You may be asked to provide the following information depending on your SIM card. (Order may not be consistent):
 - Create your passcode.
 - Record your name announcement and greeting.
 - Set the language preference (press 1 for English and 2 for Spanish)


Important: Voicemail Passcode – It is strongly recommended that you create a passcode when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a passcode, anyone who has access to your phone can access your voicemail messages.

3-way Calling & Conference Calling


With conference calling, also known as 3-way calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. On the phone screen, enter a number (or place a call from Log or Contacts).
- 2. Once you have established the connection, using the Right Soft Ket to select Options.
- 3. Select **Add call**, and dial the second number (or place the call from Log or Contacts).
 - This puts the first caller on hold and dials the second number.





- 4. You're connected to the second party.
- 5. For conference calls, select Merge Call.



Call Settings

Your phone's Call Settings menu lets you configure your voicemail options and more.

Use the Call Settings Menu

- 1. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter **Apps List**
- 2. Select Settings > Call settings
 - The call settings menu appears.



- 3. Configure your options.
 - Select a menu item to display its options.
 - Select your options and follow the prompts to set them.
 - Your call settings options are set.

Call Settings Options

Use the Call Settings menu to adjust the following settings:

Setting	Description
Answer options	Select how to answer an incoming call including "Flip open" "Any key" or both.
Ignore with message	Edit the message when rejecting a call and sending a message.
Speed dial	Edit speed dial numbers.
Voice mail	Set voicemail notifications, service carrier, voicemail number, and more.
Block numbers	Block numbers from calling your phone by adding them to the Blocked numbers list.
Fixed dialing numbers	Add fixed dialing numbers. When set, you can only call those numbers.
Call Duration	Check call duration.
Call forwarding	Set call-forwarding functions.
Additional settings	Setup Caller ID and Call waiting.

RTT Call

RTT (Real-Time Text) is a smartphone texting feature that can make it easier to have a live conversation, especially if you have a hearing or speech impairment.


When you use RTT, each character is transmitted immediately as you type it. You do not have to write an entire message before you can send it, like when you are texting. RTT eliminates that delay between sending and receiving messages, making it feel like a more natural form of communication than TTY or texting.

RTT Call Tips

- An RTT call can be placed like a voice call once the RTT settings are set to "Always Visible". The RTT call key will appear on the dialer.
- RTT includes audio, so mute the call if you don't want to share audio and turn down your volume if you don't want others near you to hear audio.
- Set the RTT call option to "Always Visible" in settings if you use RTT often.
- RTT calls use voice minutes. Check your rate plan for details.

To set the RTT operation mode:

- 1. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter the **Apps List**.
- 2. Select Settings > Accessbility > RTT > RTT operation mode.



3. Select Visible during calls to make the RTT call key visible only during

calls. - or -

Select **Always visible** to make the RTT call key always visible on the keypad.

Contacts

The Contacts application lets you store and manage contacts from a variety of sources, including contacts you enter and save directly on your phone.

Contacts Cautions

Information saved in Contacts may be lost or changed if the battery is left uncharged. Accidents or malfunction may also cause loss or change to information. It is recommended that you keep a separate copy of contacts and other important information. Your carrier is not responsible for any damages from lost or changed contacts.

Phone Number

Follow the instructions below to display your phone's wireless phone number.

1. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter the **Apps List**, then go to **Settings > About phone > My phone number**.




Add a Contact

- 2. Select Options > Settings.
 - You will see the Import Contacts menu.





Export Contacts

If you are saving contacts to an account that does not automatically back them up via the Cloud, you can manually back them up to a .vcf file for re-import if needed.

 - You will see the Contacts list.
- 2. Select Options > Settings.



- You will see the Export contacts menu.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the export.
 - The contacts are exported and saved.

Messages

With wireless service and your phone's message capabilities, you have the opportunity to share information through many different channels and accounts.

Text and Multimedia Messages

With text messages (SMS), you can send and receive instant text messages between your wireless phone and another messages-ready phone.

Multimedia messages, or MMS, can contain text and photos, recorded voice, audio or video files, contact cards (vCard), or appointments (vCalendar).

See your service plan for applicable charges for messages.

Send a Text Message

Quickly compose and send text messages on your phone.

- 1. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter the **Apps List**, then select **Messages**. Alternatively, press the **Right Soft Key** from the home screen to enter **Messages**.
- 2. On the Messages screen, select New.
- 3. Fill in one or more recipients. You can:
 - Enter phone numbers directly in the recipient field. As you enter information, any
 matching phone numbers from your contacts list are displayed. Select a match to enter
 that number or address directly.
 - Press the Left Soft Key to change between the number and letter input method.



- 4. Select the "Type text message" box, then start composing your message.
- 5. When done, select **Send** to send the text message.

Send a Multimedia Message (MMS)

You can send a multimedia message (MMS) with photos, video files, or contact cards

- 1. From the home screen, press **OK** to enter the **Apps List**, then select **Messages**. Alternatively, press the **Right Soft Key** from the home screen to enter **Messages**.
- 2. On the Messages screen, select New.
- 3. Fill in one or more recipients. You can:
 - Enter phone numbers directly in the Enter recipient field. As you enter information, any
 matching phone numbers from your contacts list are displayed. Select a match to enter
 that number or address directly.
- 4. Select the "Text message" box, and then start composing your message.
- 5. Select **Options > Add attachment.**
- 6. Select the attachment. You can choose to add pictures, audio, videos, and/or contact.



7. Select **Send** to send the MMS message.

Save and Resume a Draft Message

To save the draft message, while composing a text or multimedia message, use the **Up Navigation Key** to move the cursor to the very front of the text box, then press the **Return Key**, and select **Save draft.**

To resume composing the message:

- 1. On the Messages screen, select the message to resume editing it.
- 2. When you finish editing the message, select **Send**.

New Messages Notification

Depending on your notification settings, the phone will play ringtone and/or vibrate when you receive a new text or multimedia message. To change the notification for new text and multimedia messages, see Text and MMS Options for details.

A new message icon also appears in the notifications area of the status bar to notify you of a new text or multimedia message. The Messages application icon (if shown on the home screen) also displays a dot to notify new messages.

To open the message, press the **Right Soft Key** to enter the Message.

Manage Message Conversations

Text and multimedia messages that are sent to and received from a contact (or a number) are grouped into conversations or message threads in the Messages screen. Text or MMS conversations let you see exchanged messages (similar to a chat program) with a contact on the screen.

Read a Text Message

To read a text message, perform one of the following:

- On the Messages screen, select the text message or conversation to open and read it.
- If you have a new message notification, press the **Left Soft Key** from the home screen to display the Notifications panel. Select the new message to open and read it.

To return to the Messages screen from a conversation, press the **Return Key**.

View a Multimedia Message (MMS)

- 1. On the Messages screen, select a multimedia message or conversation to open it.
- 2. Select the attachment to open it.

Reply to a Message

- 1. On the Messages screen, select a conversation to open it.
- 2. Select the text box at the bottom of the screen, enter your reply message, and then select **Send**.

Note: To reply to a text message with a multimedia message, open the text message, and select Attach.

The text message is automatically converted into a multimedia message.

Delete Conversations

- 1. On the Messages screen, select Options > Delete thread.
- 2. Select **DELETE** to confirm.

Delete a Single Message

- 1. While viewing a conversation, select the message that you want to delete.
- 2. Select **Delete** on the options menu.

3. When prompted to confirm, select **Delete**.

Text and MMS Options

The messages settings menu lets you control options for your text and MMS messages including default SMS app, group Messages, and notifications.



 - Wireless emergency alerts: set wireless emergency alerts here.

Camera and Video

You can use the camera to take photos and videos.

Camera

The camera's viewfinder screen lets you view your subject and access camera controls and options.



- Gallery: enter Gallery and view photos.
- Video: to switch to the video mode.
- Zoom slider: use the Volume Keys or the * and # as zoom slider.
- Flash: press Up the Navigation Key to switch the flash on or off.
- Shutter: press OK Key or the Camera Key at the side of the phone to take a phone or begin/stop video recording.

Switch Camera Modes

Press the Right Soft Key to select a camera mode.

- Video: Video mode allows you to record a video.
- Photo: Photo mode allows you to take a photo.

Take Photos and Record Videos

The following topics teach you how to take photos and record videos with your phone's camera.

Camera Cautions

If the lens becomes dirty: Fingerprints/smudges on the lens prevent capturing of clear still images/videos. Wipe the lens with a soft cloth beforehand.

Avoid exposure to direct sunlight: Be careful not to expose the lens to direct sunlight for long periods. It may discolor the color filter and affect the color of images.



Take a Photo

Question: Phone freezes/operation is unstable.

Power key for a few seconds to force your device to restart. Data that was being edited is

erased after your phone is powered on again.

Question: Cannot use phone, or internet.

Answer 1: Check whether you are where signal is weak or out of the service area.

Answer 2: Restart the phone.

Answer 3: Is the phone in Airplane mode? Check that Airplane mode is disabled.

Answer 4: Is data communication disabled? Check that data communication is enabled.

Question: Battery level goes down quickly.

Answer: Are you where signal is weak or have been out of service area for a long period?

Calling where the signal is weak or is out of service area uses a lot of Battery.

Question: Cannot unlock the screen.

Answer: Restart the phone. If you are unable to turn the phone off, press and hold the

Power key for a few seconds to force your device to restart. Data that was being edited is

erased after your phone is powered on again.

Question: Difficulty hearing audio during a call.

Answer 1: It may not be possible to make a call properly in a noisy location.

Answer 2: When calling using a Speaker, check the call volume. Raise the call volume if the sound is not clear.

Question: Sound pops momentarily during a call.

Answer: Are you changing location while calling? Sound pops when the signal is weak and the phone switches to a different coverage area.

Question: The call does not connect.

Answer 1: Was the number dialed using the area code? If not, try dialing using the full 10-digit number including the area code.

Answer 2: Are you in an area with poor wireless coverage? Try calling again from another area.

Consumer Information on SAR

This Model Phone Meets the Government's Requirements for Exposure to Radio Waves. Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government. Because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels to use only the power required to reach the network, generally, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government-adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model. This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 0.59 inches (1.5 cm) between the user's body and the back of the phone. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 0.59 inches (1.5 cm) must be maintained between the user's body and the back of the phone. Third-party belt clips, holsters, and similar accessories containing metallic components should not be used.

Body-worn accessories that cannot maintain a 0.59-inch (1.5 cm) separation distance between the user's body and the back of the phone and have not been tested for typical body-worn operations may not comply with FCC RF exposure limits and should be avoided.

The FCC has granted Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF emission guidelines.

The SAR values for this model phone (FCC ID: 2A28USL006D) when tested for use at the ear is 0.61 W/kg and when worn on the body is 0.97 W/kg as described in this user's guide. While there may be differences between SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.
