Before setting up your TV


This TV's instruction manual only provides the steps to prepare the TV for Wall-Mount installation before it is installed on the wall.

Your TV can be mounted to a wall using a suitable Wall-Mount Bracket (not supplied). If the Table-Top Stand is attached to the TV, the TV may require detaching the Table-Top Stand; (Detaching the Table-Top Stand from the TV).

Prepare the TV for the Wall-Mount Bracket before making cable connections. For product protection and safety reasons, Sony strongly recommends that installation of



Detaching the Table-Top Stand from the TV

2 Repeat the previous step and remove the other side of the Table-Top Stand.







Troubleshooting

General troubleshooting for issues like: black screen, no sound, frozen picture, TV does not respond, or network is lost, do the following steps.

- 1 Restart your TV by pressing the power button on the remote control until a message appears. The TV will restart. If the TV does not recover, try unplugging the AC power cord. Then press the power button on the TV and wait for two minutes, and plug in the AC power cord.
- 2 Refer to the Help menu by pressing **HELP** on the remote control.
- 3 Connect your TV to the Internet and perform a software update. Sony recommends you to keep your TV software updated. Software updates provide new features and performance
- **4** Perform the factory data reset. Refer to "How to reset the TV to factory settings".
