

BASIC CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM

1. Stitch (Abbreviated 'st')

Every piece of crocheted fabric starts with a slip knot. Loop the yarn around two fingers, leaving a tail, and pull the end halfway through the loop. Insert the crocheted hook into the second loop and gently pull the loop over onto the crocheted hook.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crocheted fabric and is also called a foundation chain.



3. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st')

The slip stitch is the flattest or smoothest of all crocheted stitches. You can use this stitch to slip-stitch the ends of a foundation chain to form a ring.



4. Single Crochet (Abbreviated 'sc')

The single crochet is the most fundamental of all stitches. Gather the yarn with your crocheted hook and draw up the loop through the stitch. Along the yarn around the hook and pull it through two loops, leaving one loop on the hook.



5. Increase (Abbreviated 'inc')

You can increase stitches by adding a stitch at the beginning of the row. For example, make 2 sc in the same stitch.



6. Decrease (Abbreviated 'dec')

You can decrease stitches, which is really just subtracting a stitch, in a row. Make a half sc, in which point there are 2 loops in the hook, then another half sc in the next loop, at which point there are 3 loops in the hook. Last, draw the yarn through all 3 loops to finish a dec.



7. Magic Ring

A magic ring is an adjustable starting method used for crocheted amigurumi patterns, grumpy squams and other patterns that work in round rounds. Form a loop with your yarn. You will need to keep the yarn around your fingers, insert the hook through the loop, slide the crocheted hook under right piece of yarn from right to left, and the hook tip to grab onto a left yarn. Pull the yarn through the ring, make a chain stitch. Pull your left side of stitches into the ring. For example, make 4 sc. Pull yarn ends. Hold the working end of the yarn taut while gently pulling down on the tail end. As you do this, the stitches should close together at the center, completing your magic ring. Finally, slip stitch into the first stitch. To close the round and start the remainder of your pattern, make a slip stitch into the first stitch of your ring, and proceed to the next round.



8. Round (Abbreviated 'Rd')

This continues the single stitches and is made. Each round starts with a 1 and ends with a 2.

9. Sewing

Generally used for the connection of 2 parts. The plastic needle and yarn are threaded in turn through the knots where the two parts need to be connected.



If needed, need to be stitched onto the finished product (such as mouth, eyes, etc.) Use the plastic needle and thread to create small stitches to represent facial features etc.



10. Fasten Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Fasten off by pulling the yarn through the last stitch and pulling it tight. Cut off.



11. Weaving In/Invisible Close

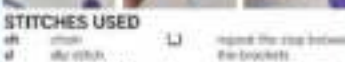
Cut the yarn, leaving a long yarn end. Cross the end through the first loop on the hook and thread it onto a yarn needle. Weave your needle through the first loop only for the last round and pull tight. Weave remaining yarn into your piece.



Please noted that all yarns needs to be hidden behind the stitch.



12. Insert Your Hook Into 2nd Back Loop



STITCHES USED

sl st: slip stitch
sc: single crochet
inc: increase (double)
dec: decrease (single)

MAKE A CROCHET BEAR

1. Head

Please use the pink yarn!

R1: 8 sc, insert your hook into 2nd back loop to create 7 sc (17 sts)

R2: 7 sc to the other side inc 5 sc inc (22 sts)

R3: 2 sc, inc, sc, inc, 18 sc (28 sts)

R4: 20 sc (20 sts)

R5: 4 sc, inc, 15 sc (21 sts)

R6: 21 sc (21 sts)

R7: 3 sc, dec, 14 sc (20 sts)

R8: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)



R9 with the fourth:
R9: sc, dec, 3 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)



2. Body

Please use the pink yarn!

R1: 8 sc, insert your hook into 2nd back loop to create 7 sc (17 sts)

R2: 7 sc to the other side inc 5 sc inc (22 sts)

R3: 2 sc, inc, sc, inc, 18 sc (28 sts)

R4: 20 sc (20 sts)

R5: 4 sc, inc, 15 sc (21 sts)

R6: 21 sc (21 sts)

R7: 3 sc, dec, 14 sc (20 sts)

R8: 20 sc (20 sts)

R9 with the fourth:
R9: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R10: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R11: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R12: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R13: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R14: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R15: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R16: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R17: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)

R18: 3 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 12 sc (18 sts)



4. Hand x 2

Please use the pink yarn!

R1: 4 sc in magic ring (4 sts)

R2: 3 sc, 2 sc (7 sts)

R3: 2 sc, 2 sc, 2 sc, dec, sc (10 sts)

R4: 8 sc (8 sts)



5. Feet x 2

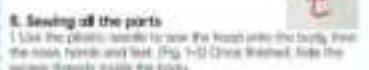
Please use the pink yarn!

R1: 7 sc in magic ring (7 sts)

R2: 3 sc, 4 sc (10 sts)

R3: 2 sc, 2 sc, 2 sc, dec, sc (7 sts)

R4: 8 sc (8 sts)



6. Sewing all the parts

1. Use the plastic needle to sew the head into the body. Sew the head, hands and feet. (Fig. 5-6) Close. Washed. Add the sewing threads inside the body.
