

## BASIC CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM

### 1. Slip (Abbreviated 'sl')

Evenly place of crocheted chain starts with a slip knot. Loop the yarn around two fingers, looping or hold and pull the end half-way through the loop. Insert the crocheted hook into the bottom loop and gently pull the loop from the crocheted knot.



### 2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain.



### 3. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st')

This slip stitch is the basics of all crochet stitches. You can use the stitch by slip stitching at the ends of a foundation chain to form a ring.



### 4. Single Crochet (Abbreviated 'sc')

The single crocheted is the most fundamental of all stitches. Gather the yarn with your crocheted hook and draw up the loop through the stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull it through two loops, leaving one loop on the hook.



### 5. Increase (Abbreviated 'inc')

You can increase stitches by adding a stitch at the beginning of the row. For example, rows 2 and 3 in the corner knot.



### 6. Decrease (Abbreviated 'dec')

This decreases stitches which is useful for decreasing a width to a keyhole. Make a half inc, in which you have three rows. Knit in the front, then produce a half inc in the next hook; at which point there are 2 loops in the hook, and finally knit the yarn through the two loops to decrease a row.



### 7. Magic Ring

A magic ring is an adjustable starting round used for crocheted amigurumi patterns, giving squares and other patterns that work in circular rounds. Form a loop with your yarn. You will need to loop the yarn around your fingers, insert the hook through the loop. Wrap the crocheted hook under right piece of yarn from right to left, and the hook tip to grab onto the left yarn, pull the yarn through the ring, repeat a circle stitch. Pull your last row of stitches into the ring. For example, make 6 inc. Pull your ends. Hold the working end of the yarn out while gently pulling down on the tail end. As you do this, the stitches should close together at the center, completing your magic ring. Finally, do slant incs, the first slant. To close this round and start the remainder of your pattern, make a slip stitch into the first stitch of your ring, and proceed to the next round.



### 8. Round (Abbreviated 'Rd')

This continues the circle stitches into a circle. Each round starts with an inc and ends with a dec.



### 9. Sewing

Generally used for the connection of 2 parts. The plastic needle and yarn are threaded in turn through the holes where the two parts need to be connected.



If you want to be stitched with the finished product (such as mouth, eyes, etc.) Use the plastic needle and thread to create small stitches to represent facial features etc.



### 10. Faste Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Finish off by pulling the yarn through the end stitch and pulling it tight.



### 11. Weaving In/Invisible Close

Cut the yarn, leaving a long yarn end. Cross the end through the back loop on the hook and thread it onto a needle. Thread your needle through the front loops only on the last round and pull tight. Weave remaining part into your piece.



### 12. Insert Your Hook Into 2nd Back Hoop

### MAKE A CROCHET BEAR

#### 1. Head

Please use the pink yarn.

- 1.1 ch 6, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to crocheted 7 as 1st row
- 1.2 ch 2 to the corner points 5 as inc, inc, inc, 2 as inc [8 as]
- 1.3 2 as inc, inc, inc, 3 as inc [10 as]
- 1.4 2 as inc, inc, inc, 3 as inc [10 as]
- 1.5 2 as inc, inc, inc, 3 as inc [10 as]
- 1.6 2 as inc, inc, inc, 3 as inc [10 as]
- 1.7 2 as inc, inc, inc, 3 as inc [10 as]
- 1.8 2 as inc, inc, inc, 3 as inc [10 as]




#### 2. Nose

- 2.1 Please use the pink yarn,
- 2.2 8 as inc in magic ring [8 as]
- 2.3 8 as inc, 8 as inc [16 as]
- 2.4 12 as inc [16 as]




#### 4. Hand x 2

- (Please use the pink yarn)
- 4.1 4 as inc in magic ring [4 as]
- 4.2 3 as inc, 2 as inc [6 as]
- 4.3 2 as inc, 2 as inc, 3 as inc [9 as]
- 4.4 6 as inc [6 as]



#### 5. Feet x 2

- (Please use the pink yarn)
- 5.1 7 as inc in magic ring [7 as]
- 5.2 3 as inc, 2 as inc [9 as]
- 5.3 2 as inc, 2 as inc, 3 as inc [12 as]
- 5.4 6 as inc [6 as]




#### 6. Sewing all the parts

1. Use the plastic needle to sew the nose onto the body, then the hands, arms and feet. (Fig. 1-6) Once finished, hide the excess threads inside the body.
