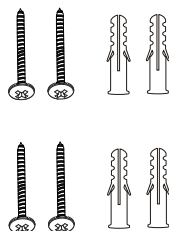
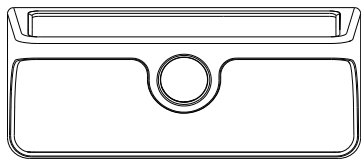
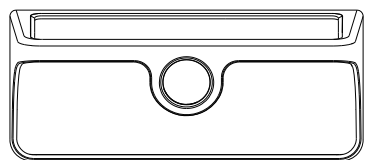


1. It is recommended to turn off the light and charge it under direct sunlight for 1-2 days before the first use. Make sure the product has enough power.
2. Solar linkage wall Light must be installed outdoors to get enough sunshine from the sun.
3. If the brightness of the light is found to be low in the process of use, it means that the light enters a low power protection state, which is a normal phenomenon. It will return to high brightness after it's fully charged.
4. The solar panel should be cleaned with a damp cotton cloth on a regular basis for ensure optimal performance and battery charging.

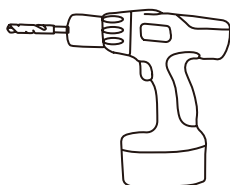
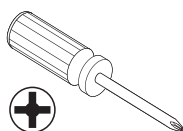


Be sure to keep the solar panels in an environment with sufficient sunlight.

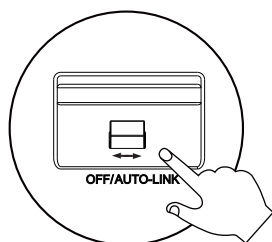

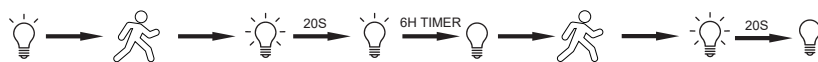

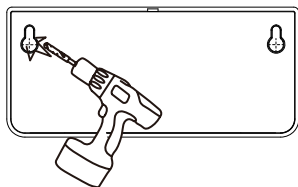


AUTO-LINK: Dim Light + Motion Sensor Mode :Light will stay dim at dusk for 6h timer, and light up when motion detected.



TIP:At night, it receives linkage signals from other lamps to trigger the lights to turn on.

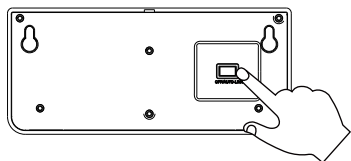
1 Drilling holes.



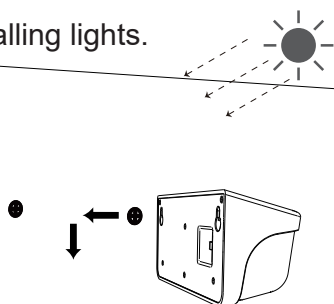
2 Fixing screw.



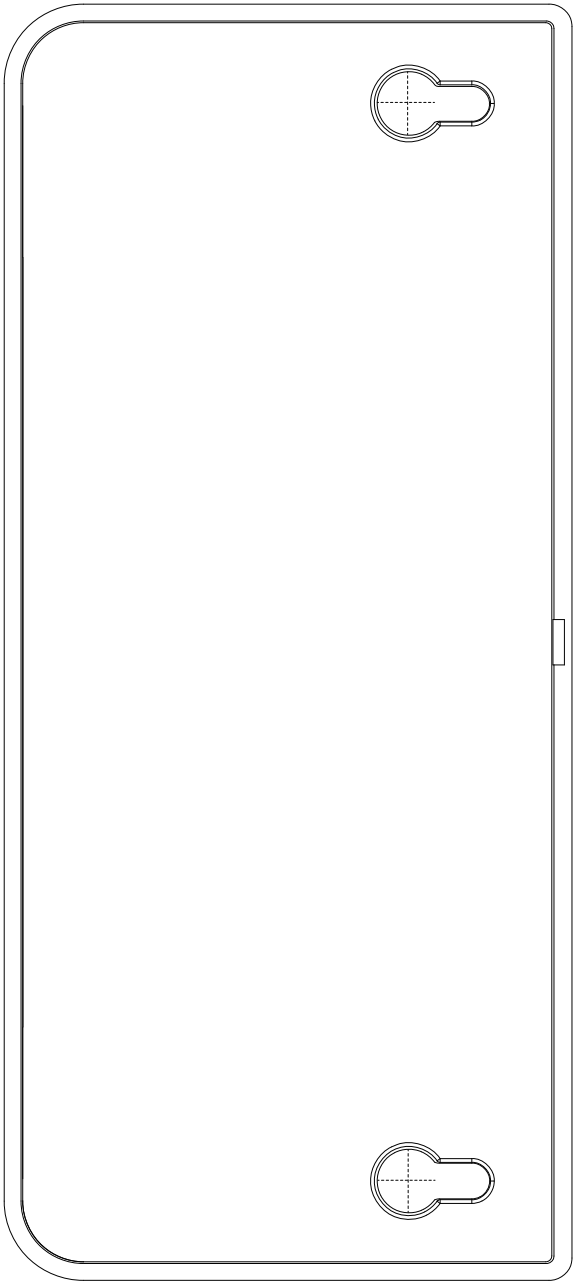
3 Turn on.
