### 1. What is Creality Print?

Creality Print is a FDM slicing software independently developed by Shenzhen Creality 3D Technology Co., Ltd. The software is designed specifically for Creality FDM 3D printer and supports three slicing modes (FDM/Laser/CNC).

#### 1.1 FDM Mode

Launch Creality Print and add a printer and select the FDM mode. Creality Print features the built-in Creality Cloud Model Library, enabling model search, download, import, save, collect and share functionalities. It also allows for the importation of local models. Slice by editing the model and support, setting printer, material and parameter configuration. The generated G-code file can be saved to your PC, USB flash drive or SD card. It also allows LAN printing and control. Moreover, it offers the capability to upload to CrealityCloud for cloud-based printing and control. Creality Print also supports the functionality of uploading model to CrealityCloud. Additionally, there are various practical algorithms and fun features.

#### 1.2 Laser Mode

Launch the software and select the CP-01 or Ender-3 S1 Laser printer. Switch to the Laser mode and import the object file. After editing the object file and adjusting the slicing parameters, you can start the slicing process. The generated G-code file can be saved to a USB flash drive or SD card, which is then inserted into the printer for printing and control.

### 1.3 CNC Mode

Launch the software and select the CP-01 printer . Switch to the CNC mode and import the object file. After editing the object file and adjusting the slicing parameters, you can start the slicing process. The generated G-code file can be saved to a USB flash drive or SD card, which is then inserted into the device for printing and control.

### 1.4 Where to Download Creality Print?

The Creality Print slicing software is included on a randomly provided USB flash drive or SD card in the printer packaging. Alternatively, you can download the latest Creality Print from the official Creality Cloud website. We offer versions for both Windows ,Mac and Linux operating systems.

# 2. Install Creality Print

Open the installation program for Creality Print. If the software has not been installed before, it will directly proceed to the installation prompt page. If it is already installed, a prompt will appear saying "Creality Print is already installed. Do you want to uninstall the old version before installing the new version?"

**Note:** If you select "Yes", the old version will be uninstalled first, and then the new version will be installed; otherwise, if you select "No", the old version will be preserved, and the new version will be installed alongside it.



If the software is currently running, a prompt will appear saying "The system has detected that the software is running. Do you want to close the software?" If you choose "No", the installation process will be interrupted and the software installation will exit. If you choose


"Yes," the software application process will be closed, and the uninstallation and reinstallation of the software will continue.


During installation, if you click "Cancel" or the close icon in the upper right corner to cancel, you will be prompted "Do you want to terminate the installation of Creality Print?", select "No" to continue the software installation process, select "Yes" to terminate the installation of Creality Print.




After confirming to continue the software installation, click "Next" and accept the software's license agreement. Select the installation path for the software and continue to the next step. Click "Install" to initiate the installation process. Once the installation is complete, check "Run Creality Print" and clicking "Finish" to complete directly install the software and run the installed software. If you don't check it, the software will be installed directly without running the software.














# 3. Slice Printing

After the installation is complete, "Run Creality Print" is selected by default, or you can run and open the Creality Print by double-clicking the desktop icon.





When the software is started for the first time, you will be prompted to select the language (English/简体中文/繁体中文), server location (China/International), and select or add printer.

Note: More languages will be supported later.








Note: Currently, there are three slicing modes (FDM/Laser/CNC) available when selecting the CP-01. When selecting the Ender-3 S1 Laser, there are two slicing modes (FDM/Laser) available, while other printers only support the FDM mode.

## 3.1 FDM Slicing

### 3.1.1 Import 3D Models

After entering the FDM home page, you can import model files or pictures for slice printing. The model can be a local STL/OBJ model file, or you can also download and import your favorite models in the Creality Cloud Model Library. And you can also import a picture file to generate a model file.

1. From the menu bar, click on "File(F)" and then select "Open File". Select the model file you want to import in the open pop-up page, and click "Open".



2. On the top left corner of the software's home page, click "File(F)" to open a file;




Click the "+" button in the Model List to add a model file;




4. Open the built-in model library in the menu bar or on the home page, select the model for download, and import the downloaded model into the software.











Note: When downloading models from the model library, you must log in to your Creality Cloud account. After downloading, you can directly enter the Download Management Center on the home page to import, export, save and delete the models.

5. Click "File(F)" on the top left corner of the home page to open the file. Select the picture file to be imported on the open pop-up page, configure the image settings parameters, and generate the model;








### 3.1.2 Model Slice

#### 3.1.2.1 Select Printer

Select the printer model you want to use from the dropdown menu on the right side of the Prepare page. If there is no matching printer model, click on "Add" to add a printer model. You can also edit parameter configuration mode and customize the printer through printer management.



#### 3.1.2.2 Select material

After selecting the printer, the supported material for the model will be displayed. Choose the material you want to use from the dropdown menu. If there are no matching material available, click on "Add" to add a new material. You can also edit parameter configuration and create a custom material in material manage.



### 3.1.2.3 Select Configuration

After selecting the material, the configuration file will display the default parameter configuration for that material. Here, you can choose a default configuration or create a new

custom parameter configuration. Once you have set the parameter configuration, you can proceed with the slicing operation.




#### 3.1.2.4 Start Slice

After importing the model and selecting the model, material, and parameter configuration, you can click "Slice" on the software page to perform the slicing operation. (Please note that the current slicing operation is performed on the entire printing platform, not a single model).

**Note:** When the model exceeds the boundary of the printing platform, a message will be displayed "Model out of range. Do you want to continue slicing?"



If the model is within the platform range, the slicing operation will be performed directly.




### 3.1.3 Slice Preview

After the slicing is complete, you will enter the G-code preview page. In the preview page, you can view the G-code preview report, configure the preview mode, adjust the display mode, preview the animation, and exit the preview.


### 3.1.3.1 G-code preview report

On the top left corner of the preview page, you can view the G-code preview report. Here, you can check information such as printing time, material length, material weight, material cost and other details.




### 3.1.3.2 Preview mode setting


You can configure the preview mode on the top left corner of the preview page, and have the option to check the printing platform and nozzle.



### 3.1.3.3 Display mode


On the left side of the preview page, you can customize the display mode. Here, you can choose between color show display and G-code display. In color display mode, you can further select different modes to visualize speed, structure and nozzle information. G-code mode provides a view of the current G-code information.






### 3.1.3.4 Start Preview

At the bottom of the preview page, you can start the simulated print preview, where there are settings for Print Speed, Preview Way, Steps Number, Layer Number and Only Show X Layer, and operations for Start/Suspend.



### 3.1.3.5 Switching between Prepare, Preview and Device Pages

At the top of the interface, there are Prepare, Preview, and Device status pages that can be clicked to switch between them. By clicking on each tab, you can enter the Prepare page, Preview page and Device page respectively. (Note: The preview page cannot be entered if there is no slicing data available in the software).




### 3.1.4 G-code Printing/Exporting/Uploading

After the model slicing is done, there are three options for handling the generated G-code: LAN Printing, Export to Local, and Upload to Creality Cloud.


#### 3.1.4.1 LAN Printing

When selecting "LAN Printing", a G-code preview and editing page will appear. After confirming, you will be redirected to the LAN Device page. From there, you can choose one or multiple devices for "Send G-code" or "One-Click Printing" operations. Additionally, you can click on "Details" to view detailed information about individual LAN devices.


Note: LAN devices can be added either by automatic scanning or manually adding the IP address.



(Preview, edit and confirm G-code files)




(Select a device and send/print)

### 3.1.4.2 Export to local

When selecting "Export to Local", a file dialog box will pop up. You can edit the file name and choose the save location. Once successfully saved, a confirmation message will appear.




(Edit and save G-code)




(Prompt for successful save)

### 3.1.4.3 Upload G-code to Creality Cloud

When selecting "Upload to CrealityCloud", the software will first check if you are logged in to Creality Cloud. If you are not logged in, it will prompt you to log in first. If you are already logged in, a G-code preview and editing page will appear. After confirming the G-code, it will be uploaded directly to Creality Cloud. Once the upload is successful, a prompt confirming the successful upload will appear.

# 3.2 Laser Slicing


When selecting the Ender-3 S1 Laser and CP-01 models, you can perform laser engraving slicing by switching to the laser mode on the Prepare page.



### 3.2.1 Import Objects


On the left side of the page, you can perform object import operations, supporting various file types such as images, rectangles, shapes and text.

Note: For image files, the supported formats are .jpg, .bmp, .png, .svg, and .dxf.



### 3.2.2 Edit Objects


After importing the objects, you can edit the selected object, including operations such as moving, resizing, and rotating.




### 3.2.3 Configure Parameters and Save

For pictures, graphics or text objects, you can set parameters such as engraving count, engraving power, working speed and processing mode (black and white, grayscale by line,


grayscale dithering, vector). For image objects, the configuration parameters include engraving count, engraving power and working speed. For text objects, the configuration parameters include engraving count, engraving power, working speed, text content, font, font size, etc.



(Image parameter configuration)




(Shape parameter configuration)



(Text parameter configuration)


# 3.2.4 Laser Slicing

After configuring the parameters, click on "Generate G-code File" to initiate the laser slicing process.

# 3.3 CNC Slicing


When selecting the CP-01 model, you can perform CNC engraving and slicing by switching to the CNC mode on the Prepare page.



# 3.3.1 Import Objects


On the left side of the page, you can perform object import operations. Image files are supported.

After importing objects, you can edit the selected objects, including operations such as Move, scale and rotate.




# 3.3.3 Configure Parameters and Save

By selecting an object, you can edit the configuration parameters. The supported editing functions include engraving power, engraving speed, idle speed, working speed, engraving depth, and idling height.

After configuring the parameters, click on "Generate G-code File" to initiate the CNC slicing process.




# 3.3.5 Save G-code Files

# 4. FDM Slicing Functionality




The main interface of the software can be divided into several functional areas, including the Menu Bar, Toolbar, Status Bar, Model List, Printer/Material/Slicing Configuration, Creality Cloud Center, and Models.

# 4.1 Menu Bar

The Menu Bar consists of six menu functions: File, Edit, View, Tool, Models and Help. Each menu has various sub-menu functions.



Delete all models on the printing platform.

Clone the selected model.

Split the selected model.

### 4.1.2.9 Merge Model

Merge the selected models.



Switch the printing platform view to the bottom view.



Perform error analysis and repair on selected models, including damaged plane, hole, redundant shell, normal, crossed model plane, and other data issues.






# 4.1.4.5 Manage material







Clicking on "Update" will check the version number, and if it is the latest version, it will prompt "You are currently on the latest version and do not need to update".




#### **4.1.7.3 Use Course**





In the login box, click on "Sign Up" to be redirected to the Creality Cloud web registration page. Complete the registration process, and then you can use your Creality Cloud account to log in.






# 4.3 Creality Cloud - Personal Center




# 4.3.2 My Slices






# 4.4 Model Library

# 4.4.1 Model Library Classification



Note: When uploading a model, you also need to select the model category before uploading.


#### 4.4.2 Model Search

### 4.4.3 Model Details Page






# 4.5.2 Open File

Click on the folder icon to open and select local model files, project files, or slice files. This allows you to import local files into the slicing software.




## 4.5.3 Model List






# 4.6 Operation Bar

The operation bar includes the following functions: Move, Scale, Rotate, P Bottom, Layout, Support, Others (Clone, Letter, Split, Mirror, Drill and Distance Measure).



## 4.6.1 Move


Perform moving operations on the selected model, including X/Y/Z movement, center/bottom placement, and center/bottom/reset operations.



Note: Left-clicking and dragging the mouse can also be used to scale the model. Holding the arrow allows movement along a single axis; holding the face allows movement along two axes; and holding the cube to move in three-axis directions.

## 4.6.2 Scale

Perform scaling operations on the selected model, including scaling in the X/Y/Z directions, switch or lock the Uniform for scaling, and reset operation.




Note: The uniform ratio lock is enabled by default. If you manually disable it, a prompt will appear saying, "You are unlocking the uniform ratio, which means the model will not return to its original size. Do you want to proceed?"



Left-clicking and dragging the mouse can also be used to scale the model. After disabling the uniform ratio lock, you can hold the arrow to scale in a single-axis direction, hold the plane to scale in two-axis directions, and hold the cube to scale in three-axis directions.

### 4.6.3 Rotate


Perform rotating the selected model, including rotating in the X/Y/Z directions, a key can be rotated 45° or manually input the desired rotation angle, and reset operation.



Note: You can also perform three-axis rotation of the model by clicking and dragging the rotation cones for the X/Y/Z axes with the left mouse button held down.

### 4.6.4 P Bottom


This function can perform P Bottom on the selected model automatically and manually.



Note: Currently, automatic P bottom is achieved based on the maximum crosssectional area.

# 4.6.5 Layout


Currently, there are six layout options available: From Left to Right, From Right to Left, From Top to Bottom, From Bottom to Top, Centered, and Intelligent. You can choose any of these options for your operations.



Note: The imported models will be automatically placed in the optimal position.


# 4.6.6 Support

This function can perform a support operation on the selected model, includes support parameter settings, automatic support, custom support additions and deletions, and other operations.




# 4.6.6.1 Support Parameter

You can edit the support grid, maximum angle, and the option to only add support to the hot bed. More parameter settings will be added in the future.



# 4.6.6.2 Automatic Support




# 4.6.11 Mirror


# 4.10 LAN Printing

LAN printing is a feature in the software that allows you to send G-code files directly to a printer over a local network, either for sending only or for initiating the printing process.

Note: Before sending G-code over the local network, you need to add the local network device.

## 4.10.1 Add Device

Device can be added either by "Scan add" or "Manual add".



#### 4.10.1.1 Scan Add

Click on the "Scan Add" button, and the computer will scan for online devices within the LAN. Select one or more devices to add, then click the "Add" button to complete the process. If the desired device is not detected during the scan, you can click the Refresh button to rescan and refresh the device list.




If the device addition fails, you will receive a prompt saying "Printer not found!"



#### 4.10.1.2 Manual Add

Click on the "Manual Add" button, and enter the IP address of the printer device on the popup page. Then click "Add".

Note: When adding a device, you need to select either a printer device or a sonic pad device before proceeding with the addition. The default selection is a printer device.






## 4.10.2 Send Files

After slicing is completed or G-code files are imported, go to the preview page and select "LAN Printing" in the bottom right corner. This will open the G-code sending editor, where you can preview the G-code image, view printing time and material consumption. You can also edit the name of the G-code file to be sent. After clicking "OK", you will be redirected to the device list page, where you can select one or more printers to send the file or initiate a one-click printing process.







On the device list page of the LAN, you can perform device filtering operations based on device grouping, status, and type.






#### 4.10.4 Device List


In the device list page of LAN, selecting a device allows you to view its working status, device name, IP address, machine image, file name, file preview image, print time, remaining time, print progress, print speed, hotbed temperature, nozzle temperature, and other information. You can also edit the device name, set the print speed, hotbed temperature and nozzle temperature. Clicking the "Details" button allows you to view detailed information about the selected LAN device.



Note: Right-clicking on a device allows you to perform operations such as moving the device to a different group or removing the device.



When there are many devices in the LAN, you can scroll the mouse or drag the right-side scrollbar to view more devices.




#### 4.10.5 Device Details

Selecting a device and clicking the "Details" button will take you to the Device Details page. In this page, you can see the device information area, device control area, camera information area, temperature information area, and file/history information area.

#### 4.10.5.1 Basic Device Information

When a device is printing, it will display the G-code file preview image, G-code file name, layer count, printing progress, print time, remaining time, pause/continue, stop, and other information and operations. The G-code file preview image can be enlarged for better viewing.





When a device is in an idle state, the information in this area will be empty.



#### 4.10.5.2 Device Control

When the device is printing, you can observe the dynamic changes in the X/Y/Z coordinates and control the printing speed, model fan, chamber fan, auxiliary fan and LED switch.





When the device is idle, you can view the X/Y/Z coordinate information and perform X/Y/Z axis movement. You can also control the model fan, chamber fan, auxiliary fan and LED switch.



#### 4.10.5.3 Camera

If the device is equipped with a camera, you can view the camera feed. By clicking the zoom icon, you can enlarge the view to see the print in more detail.





When the device is not connected to a camera, you will not be able to view the print feed.



# 4.10.5.4 Temperature

The temperature area displays the temperature curves of the printer's nozzle and hotbed. It also allows you to adjust and set the temperatures for the nozzle and hotbed.




Note: If it is the Sermoon D3 Pro printer, this area will display four temperature curves: hotbed temperature, L nozzle temperature, R nozzle temperature, and chamber temperature. You can also adjust and set these four temperatures.



## 4.10.5.5 Files/History

The files list and history list show the G-code files stored in the printer and the G-code files that have been printed in the past. You can import G-code files here.

To import a G-code file, select the files list and click on button. In the pop-up file dialog, choose the G-code file you want to import, and click Import. After successful import, you will see the file information in the files list.





When the printer is in the printing process, selecting a file from the Files/History and clicking the left mouse button allows you to delete the file. However, files that are currently being printed cannot be deleted.

Note: During printing, the Print and Calibrate Before Print options in the left-click menu are unavailable.





When the printer is idle, selecting a file from the Files/History and clicking the left mouse button enables you to perform actions such as printing, calibrating before printing, or deleting the file from the File List. In the History list, you can choose to reprint, calibrate before print, or delete the historical file records.





# 4.11 Operation Attributes

The software provides various mouse operation attributes, including left-click selection, right-click rotation, middle-wheel translation, right-click menu, interface view manipulation, interface dragging, interface information display, and mouse guidance display.

### 4.11.1 Left-Click Selection

To select a model, simply left-click on it. You can also hold Ctrl and left-click to select multiple models.

## 4.11.2 Right-Click Rotation


By holding the right mouse button and dragging, you can rotate the platform and models. As the platform and models rotate, the view cube will also rotate accordingly.

#### 4.11.3 Middle-Wheel Translation

In the software interface, holding the middle mouse button and dragging allows you to translate the printing platform.

#### 4.11.4 Mouse Box Selection

By holding the left mouse button and dragging, you can perform box selection of platform models.




# 4.11.5 Right-Click Operation

Right-click the mouse in the software interface to bring up a context menu with various options. The context menu operations include: Import Model, Delete Model, Clone Model, Merge Model, Split Model, Select All Models, Layout, Reset All Models, Delete All Models, Bottom, P Bottom, Upload Model (Upload Local/Selected Model), Set Nozzle Range, etc.



# 4.11.6 Interface View Manipulation

In the view manipulation area in the top right corner of the software interface, by clicking on each plane, the view cube and platform view will change. Clicking on the main view angle display.



# 4.11.7 Interface Dragging Manipulation

There is a scrollbar on the right side of the software interface. After selecting a model, dragging the scrollbar up or down enables viewing the internal and external display of the model.
