Preparation for use

Unpacking and Set Up

•Remove the alarm clock radio from the carton and packaging materials. Retain the carton and packaging for future reference and in case the alarm

clock radio ever needs to be serviced or transported.
•Remove any descriptive labels or stickers on the front or top of the cabinet Do not remove any labels or stickers from the back or bottom of the cabinet. Note the serial number on the bottom of your radio and write this number in

the space provided on the Warranty page of this manual.

•Place your radio on a level surface such as a table, desk or shell convenient to an AC outlet, out of direct sunlight, and away from sources

of excess heat, dirt, dust, moisture, humidity or vibration. •Select and attach the appropriate plug attachment to the AC mains adapter. Unwind and fully extend the power cable.

•The FM antenna is built into this cord. It must be fully extended to provide Unwind the line cord connecting the AC adapter and extend it to its full







Setting the Date/Time Manually



To check the current date and time, short press "TIME SET" repeatedly to see the time month, day and year





OPress and hold "TIME SET" button the HOUR digits will blink, Press "▲"or "▼" button to adjust the hour

Press "TIME SET" button again ,the"DATE" digits will blink, Press

"▲" or "▼" button to adjust the date .

Press "TIME SET" button again and the "YEAR" digits will blink.

© Press "A" or "♥" button again "124H" or "12H" blinks on the display.

© Press "TIME SET" button again "24H" or "12H" blinks on the display.

(24H means 24-hour clock, 12H means 12-hour clock)

® Press "▲" or "▼" button to adjust the time format.

® Press "TIME SET" button again or wait for 40 seconds to save your setting.


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Setting the Alarm


Push the AL1/AL2 slide swith to ON to turn on the AL1/AL2 before

setting the alarm

Your clock radio has two separate alarms (Alarm 1 and Alarm 2) that can be set and used independently. Please ensure that you have set the wakeup time(s) and the day(s) of the week needed for the alarms correctly.



SETTING THE WAKEUP ALARMS



Push the AL1 switch slide to ON to turn on the alarm1

Push the AL2 switch slide to ON to turn on the alarm2.

Press AL1/AL2 repeatedly to select your alarm ringtone(). When " "lights up, Alarm 1 (wake to Radio) is selected.
When " "lights up, Alarm 1 (wake to Buzzer) is selected

Press and hold "AL1 (VOL-) " button for 3 seconds and the "HOUR" digits will blink. Press "▲" or "▼" to adjust the hour

Press"AL1(VOL-)"again, the MINUTE digits will blink, Press "▲" or "▼" to adjust

9 Press "AL1 (VOL-) " again and the "CURRENT VOLUME LEVEL" digits will blink. The volume levels range from VOL 1 to 16, with level 16 being the lot

Press "▲" or "▼" to adjust to your desired alarm volume level.

⑥ Press " AL1 (v0L-)" again and the "DAY(S) OF THE WEEK" texts (1-7) will blink.
⑦ Press "▲" or "▼" to select the alarm day mode(You can set the alarm days in the


Option 1: Everyday Monday to Sunday Option 2: Weekdays Monday to Friday Option 3: Weekends Saturday and Sunday

Press "AL1 (VOL⁻) " button or wait for 40 seconds to exit the alarm setting.

(9) If you need to turn off the AL1 complately, Push the AL1 slide switch to OFF.

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To set the Alarm 2, repeat the above steps 1 to 9.





Snooze/Repeat





- When the alarm goes off, press "SNOOZE" button to doze for another 9 minutes. You can repeatedly press "SNOOZE" for more dozings during the 60-minute cycle.
- Press "AL1(VOL-)/AL2(VOL+)" button to stop the alarm from
- To deactivate the alarm completely, Push the AL1/AL2 slide switch to OFF.

Playing the Fm Radio

Press " () " button to open the clock radio and press"MODE(BT PAIR)" buttonto switch to the radio mode. The frequency of "MHz" will appear on the display. For better reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the antenna. Below are the 5 instructions (A to D) to operate the radio.






A: Adjust the "MHz"


In the radio mode, when the "MHz" digits appear on the display, press"▲" or "▼" button to adjust the MHz frequency

B: Auto-search/scan FM stations

Press "▲" or "♥" buton for 2 seconds and release. The search/scan will stop at the next available lower or higher station.




C: Store FM/DAB radio station presets (max. up to 20 stations)

- @ Press and hold "STORE/MEM." button until the Program Number (from 01 to 20) appears on the display.

 ③ Press "▲" or "▼" button to change to the Program Number you desired.
- press "STORE/MEM." button again and your specific station will be stored
- D: Recall preset FM/DAB radio stations





- $\ensuremath{\mathbf{0}}$ When the radio mode is on, short press "STORE/MEM." button and the Program Number (from 01 to 20) will appear on the display.
- ② Press "▲" or "▼" button to select your stored Program Number and listen to your preset station.

Note: Keep the clock radio away from other electronic devices to avoid radio interference. For better reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the FM antenna wire.

Using the Sleep Timer

You can fall asleep to the FM radio using the sleep timer (The sleep timer duration ranges from 10 minutes to 90 minutes). After reaching the desired duration, the radio will turn off automatically.

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
- Press " () " to turn on the FM radio.
 Press the "SLEEP" button, then the "10 " digits will appear on the display which indicates the sleep timer has been set for 10 minutes.
- To change the sleep timer duration, keep pressing "SLEEP" button until your desired duration appears.
- To deactive the Sleep timer, keep pressing "SLEEP" until "OFF" appears on the display, or press " \circlearrowleft " to turn off the sleep timer directly

Note: When setting the Sleep Timer, the indicator "SLP10-90" flashes and it appears on the screen untill the sleeping time ends

Dimmer Control

To adjust the display brightness, keep pressing "DIMMER" button until vourdesired brightness level appears. Brightness is available in 4 levels and can not be adjusted even when the radio or Bluetooth connec


Press "DIMMER" button, you can adjust the brightness level as below:

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Bluetooth Connection



- 1 Press " 0" button to turn on the clock radio.
- Press "MODE(BT PAIR)" button to switch to Bluetooth (BT) connection.
- ❸ When the "BT" indicator blinks, the clock is searching for Bluetooth connection. Please turn on the Bluetooth of your external audio device and look for CKS515U for connecting. Once connected, the "BT" indicator stops blinking. Then you can play music from your external audio device through the clock speaker.
- 4 You can control the music playing either on your external audio device or by pressing "SNOOZE(►II)" button on your clock to play or pause music.
- ⑤ Press "▲" or "▼" to play music forwards/backwards
- @ Press the "VOL-" or "VOL+" button to change the volume

Note: If pairing unsuccessful, all previously paired Bluetooth devices around should be disconnected first by pressing and holding the "BT PAIR" button until it prompts, or turn Off their Bluetooth connection, in order to avoid making any auto reconnection between them. Then, set this unit to Bluetooth mode, and tap the Bluetooth switch on your phone/device Off and back "ON" again to refresh/search any nearby CKS515U for pairing.

Care and Maintenance

If the cabinet becomes dusty, wipe it with a soft cloth. it the cabinet becomes smudged or dirty, clean it with a soft, slightly dampened cloth. Never allow water or any liquid to get inside the cabinet. Never use any abrasive cleaners or cleaning pads as these will damage the finish of your radio.
