
# How to assemble your vacuum cleaner




Vacuum cleaner with dust cup.




Slide handle into top of vacuum cleaner. Push down until it clicks.




Insert bent end of hose into opening at back of dust cup. Twist hose clockwise to lock.




Store accessories on back of vacuum cleaner.




Loop hose over hose retainer.

Align upper and lower cord hooks and press to snap in place. Upper cord hook should rotate freely.




Wrap cord onto upper and lower cord hooks.




Store turbo brush on front of handle. Align brush opening with slot and push to snap tool into clip.





# How to use your vacuum cleaner




Plug power cord into outlet.



Turn height adjustment knob to adjust from bare floors to high pile carpet.




Step on power switch to turn vacuum cleaner on. Step on again to turn off.



Step on handle release to lower handle into position for vacuuming floors.

## Empty dust cup after every use



Press release button and lift off dust cup.



To empty debris, press lever to release bottom lid.

## How to use accessories

#### **A** CAUTION

When using tools, always place handle in upright position. Make sure vacuum cleaner is turned off while attaching tools.

- · Place vacuum in upright position.
- Turn height adjustment knob to highest position.
- Pull up on hose connection to release hose end from hose inlet (Fig. 1).
- Push end of hose into top of handle and twist clockwise until it clicks (Fig. 2).
- Press handle release latch and pull out handle with wand (Fig. 3).
- To attach accessories, push desired tool onto end of wand (Fig. 4).
- To use accessories without handle and wand, push desired tool directly onto end of hose (Fig. 5).
- When finished using accessories, twist hose counterclockwise and pull off handle. Slide handle into top of vacuum cleaner and push down until it clicks. Push loose end of hose securely onto hose inlet. Store tools on vacuum cleaner back. (See page 5.)















2-in-1 upholstery tool (NEU188) -Use brush to vacuum upholstered surfaces or pick up debris. Use felt portion to clean delicate surfaces. Press thumb release and lift brush up and out of the way.



Flexible telescoping crevice tool (NEU188) – Press button and pull to extend tool to desired length. To use brush, pull to swivel into position. Use for baseboards, crevices and tight spaces.



Dusting brush (NEU180, NEU181.NEU181A. NEU182A, NEU182B, NEU185, etc.) -

Use for furniture, drapes. blinds, drawers and vents, carpet and upholstery.





# How to maintain dust cup and filters


### Dust cup - Empty after each use



Press release button and lift off dust cup.



Hold dust cup over wastebasket Close bottom lid until it and press lever to release bottom lid. Debris will empty.




### Washable dust cup filters – Clean monthly




Pull dust cup latch to lift up dust cup lid.




Lift out foam filter and shake off dust. Rinse foam filter and dry THOROUGHLY.



Grip tabs and lift out filter screen. Twist bottom of filter screen counterclockwise to unlock and pull apart. Shake off dust. Rinse screen and dust cup. Dry all THOROUGHLY. Reassemble screen: twist clockwise to lock.



Align tab on filter screen with slot on back of dust cup and drop into position.



Reinstall foam filter.



Close cover until it clicks.



Warning: Never operate vacuum cleaner without foam filter, filter screen and dust cup in proper position.

# How to clear a blockage

#### **A** CAUTION


Make sure vacuum is turned off and power cord is unplugged.


If vacuum is not cleaning floors, or if no suction at end of hose, check to be sure air path is not blocked.


- Press release button and lift off dust cup (Fig. 1).
- Empty debris. Hold over wastebasket and press lever to release bottom lid (Fig. 2).
- Check filter and filter screen.
   Remove any debris and shake off dust. (See maintenance instructions on page 9.)
- Loosen end of hose.
- Use a rod or similar blunt implement to clear a blockage in wand or hose. Flex hose to loosen debris (Fig. 3). Use caution if there is any risk that glass or nails could have become imbedded in hose.
- Use finger to check for debris in air path (Fig. 4).
- Reinstall filter and filter screen inside dust cup and position dust cup onto vacuum cleaner.



**Warning:** Never operate vacuum cleaner without foam filter, filter screen and dust cup in proper position.









## How to maintain brushroll

#### **A** CAUTION

Make sure vacuum is turned off and power cord is unplugged.


- Step on handle release to lower handle.
- Turn vacuum face down on floor.
- To avoid unnecessary service calls, check brushroll for debris.
- Use scissors to clip heavy threads or strings.






# How to maintain turbo brush


Select models only (NEU182-NEU188 except NEU182A)



Grasp collar and twist to unlock cover. Lift cover up.



With cover open, use figers or small brush to clear accumulated pet hair from bristles.




Close cover and twist collar to lock.

# How to replace brushroll or belt

#### **A** CAUTION

Make sure vacuum is turned off and power cord is unplugged.

- Step on handle release and lay vacuum cleaner face down.
- Use Phillips screwdriver to remove 6 screws from brushroll cover (Fig. 1). Lift off cover. Refer to Fig. 7 for location of screws.
- Rotate right end of brushroll and lift out (Fig. 2).
- · Lift out left end of brushroll.
- To replace belt, position new belt around motor shaft (Fig. 3).
- Loop new belt around brushroll shaft at left end of brushroll (Fig. 4).
- To reposition brushroll into base, pull belt down and insert left end of brushroll first. Align brushroll end cap with slot so it fits into position (Fig. 5). Press right end of brushroll into position.
- To replace brushroll cover, align slot on cover with tab (Fig. 6) and snap cover into place. Replace 6 screws (Fig. 7).


















# **Problem solving**



Make sure vacuum is turned off and power cord is unplugged.

#### NOTICE: Thermal cut-off

This vacuum cleaner has a special thermostat that protects the vacuum in case of motor overheating.

If the vacuum suddenly shuts off, proceed as follows: 1) Push the power switch to off and unplug the vacuum. 2) Check the vacuum for a possible source of overheating such as a full dust cup, blocked hose or clogged filter. If these conditions are found, fix them and wait at least 30 minutes before attempting to use the vacuum. 3) After the 30 minute period, plug the vacuum back in and turn on the switch. If the vacuum still does not work, call the Eureka Customer Service HELPLINE at 1-800-282-2886.

# The Eureka two-year limited warranty

Midea America Corp. ("Eureka"), subject to the terms and conditions herein, warrants this vacuum cleaner to be free from defects in material and workmanship for a term of two years from the date of original purchase when used in accordance with the Eureka operating and maintenance instructions and under normal household usage. This warranty is granted only to the original purchaser and members of immediate household, and is applicable only to original purchases from Eureka authorized resellers.

#### What Eureka will do:

Eureka will, at its option, repair or replace a defective vacuum or vacuum part that is covered by this warranty. Repairs may be performed using new or refurbished parts that meet or exceed Eureka specifications for new parts. If Eureka elects to replace the vacuum, the replacement may be a reconditioned unit. Depending on availability of products, Eureka reserves the right to provide you with a replacement product that is the same or similar, or substitute equivalent of the original product. As a matter of warranty policy, Eureka will not refund the consumer's purchase price.

#### This warranty does not cover:

- Normal wear and tear of the vacuum and vacuum parts that require replacement under normal use such as disposable dust bags, filters, drive belts, light bulbs, brush-roll, bristles, impellers and cleaning.
- Damages or malfunctions resulting from: improper or unreasonable use or maintenance, abuse, negligence, failure to follow instructions contained in any written materials that accompany the product, deterioration by reason of excess moisture, corrosive atmosphere, lightning, power surges, connections to improper voltage supply, unauthorized alteration, or other external causes such as extremes in temperature or humidity. modifications, scratches or discoloration. accidents, misuse, or acts of God. This warranty also does not cover damage resulting from repair or attempted repair by anyone other than Eureka or an authorized Eureka Warranty Station. This warranty is not applicable to any product that has been altered or on which the serial number has been defaced, modified or removed. Altering, erasing, or forging any proof-of-purchase documents voids any applicable product warranty.

If any product submitted for warranty service is found to be ineligible, an estimate of repair cost will be furnished and the repair performed only if requested by the owner and upon receipt of payment or acceptable arrangements for payment.



## Easy assembly

- **1.** Slide wand onto hand vacuum until it clicks (Fig. 1).
- **2.** Push wand into motorized floor nozzle until it clicks (Fig. 2).

#### How to install wall mount


- Choose location near power outlet.
   Locate point high enough on wall to allow wand and motorized floor nozzle to hang freely.
- Place mount against wall and use pencil to mark drill holes.
- Drill holes (with 1/4" bit) and insert drywall anchors. Insert screws through holes on mount and tighten until firmly attached (Fig. 3).






# Battery indicator lights show level of charge (Fig. 4):

- A. Half charged
- B. Fully charged
- Indicator lights stop blinking when fully charged.
- Charge battery fully before using for the first time. This may take up to six hours.









# How to use cleaner for cleaning floors

- Click power button once to start (Fig 1).
   Vacuum starts on High mode. Use Low/ High button to switch between modes.
- Using motorized floor nozzle, glide back and forth on area to be cleaned. Avoid oversized or sharp items (such as screws) with cleaner.
- 3. Twist wrist to engage swivel function.
- 4. When done, click power button once to stop motor.

#### Empty dust cup after every use

- Click the dust cup release button, located on the front of the handle just above the dust cup and pull dust cup out. (Fig. 2).
- 2. Press lever to release bottom lid of dust cup to empty debris. (Fig. 2)
- To place the dust cup back, angle it forward so the lower hook catches in the slot and then gently push it back towards the wand until you hear click indicating it is locked in place. (Fig. 3)


# How to use hand vacuum and accessories




**Moving parts!** Aways turn off hand vacuum before attaching accessories.


The hand vacuum can be used with or without tools.

- To use without tools, press release button and remove wand. Collect debris directly with hand vacuum nozzle (Fig. 4).
- To use tools with wand, press release button to remove motorized floor nozzle. Slide tool onto end of wand until it clicks (Fig. 5).
- To use tools with hand vacuum only, press release button to remove wand. Slide tool onto hand vacuum until it clicks.










Use with or without wand.


• 2-in-1 upholstery tool: Use brush to vacuum blinds, vents or upholstered surfaces. Use felt portion to clean delicate surfaces. To switch between felt and brush portions, press thumb release and slide brush up or down.



# How to use hand vacuum and motorized floor nozzle

Ideal for cleaning stairs.

- Press release button to remove wand from hand vacuum.
   Attach motorized floor nozzle directly to hand vacuum until it clicks.
- Click power button once to start. Vacuum starts on High mode. Use Low/High button to switch between modes depending on suction power desired.



## How to maintain your vacuum cleaner





#### Dust cup - Empty after each use



Click the dust cup release button, located on the front of the handle just above the dust cup and pull dust cup out.



Press lever to release bottom lid of dust cup to empty debris.

#### Washable dust cup filter - clean monthly



- Click the dust cup release button, located on the front of the handle just above the dust cup and pull dust cup out.
- Lift out pre-motor filter and shake off dust frequently. Every three months rinse filter and dry THOROUGHLY.
- Reattach filter and Cyclone.
- Click dust cup back into place on unit.

#### Washable post-motor filter - clean every 6 months



- 1. Twist filter cover and remove.
  - 2. Lift out post-motor filter.
- 3 Shake to remove dust
- 4. Every 6 months, replace filter or rinse and dry THOROUGHLY.
- 5. Reposition filter and cover and twist to 'lock.'

### How to maintain brushroll

To avoid unnecessary service calls, periodically check brushroll for debris. If brushroll gets clogged it will automatically shut off. Turn vacuum off and unplug before attempting to remove clog.

#### Washable brushroll – clean frequently





Step on floor nozzle to lower handle. Turn vacuum face down on floor. Use scissors to clip heavy threads or strings.



If debris cannot be removed easily, locate the brushroll release tab on the right side and open the brushroll cover. Remove the brushroll and clear any tangled hair and remaining debris.



- To reassemble:
- 1. Align one end of brushroll with floor nozzle gear.
- 2. Press other end into slot.
- 3. Replace brushroll release tab into slot and press down to click it into place.
