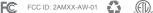

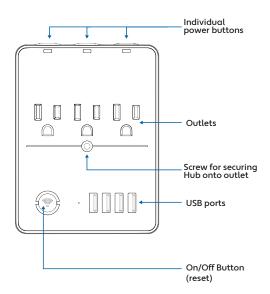

DOWNLOAD APP

- Android: download "Brookstone Smart" app on Google Play.
- 2. iPhone: download "Brookstone Smart" app from the App Store.

REGISTRATION AND LOGIN

- Run the "Brookstone Smart" app from your smart phone.
- 2. Register and login.





ADD DEVICE

- Plug in Smart Hub into electrical socket and hold down on/off button until the light blinks rapidly.
- 2. Make sure phone is connected to your Wi-Fi network and that it is a 2.4GHz network.
- Press the (+) symbol in the top right corner of the app and select the "Socket" from the the list of devices to add.



 Confirm indicator light is blinking and press the "confirm indicator rapidly blinks" button to connect in **Smart WiFi Mode**.





 Make sure phone is connected to the Wi-Fi network that the device will be connected to and that the network is a 2.4GHz network. Enter your password for the Wi-Fi network.

- Connecting process will begin. Do not turn off Smart Hub or phone while connecting. Wait for connection process to complete.
- Once device has been successfully added, name the device what you would like it to be called in the app. The Smart Hub is ready for use. (If it will not connect in Smart WiFi Mode, try to connect using AP Mode which are steps 8-11)





- Notice: Only follow steps 8-11 if connecting in AP Mode. From the smart wifi connect page click on "Other Mode" in the top right corner and select "AP Mode".
- When light is blinking rapidly hold reset button for 6 seconds and the light should now blink slowly. Click on the "confirm indicator slowly blinks" button.





- 10. Make sure phone is connected to the Wi-Fi network that the device will be connected to and that the network is a 2.4GHz network. Enter your password for the Wi-Fi network.
- Follow the on screen instructions. Connecting process will begin. Do not turn off Smart Hub or phone while connecting. Wait for connection process to complete.





CONTROLLING DUAL HUB

- From the home screen of your app click on Smart Hub.
 On the next screen you can independently control all
 outlets of the hub or the whole hub all together.
- You can also create separate schedules for each outlet of the plug. Click on the schedule button near the top and then you will see that you can click on each individual outlet of the plug. After that click on "add schedule" at the bottom. you can also create countdown timers for each outlet.

PUSH NOTIFICATIONS

- You can turn on/off notifications for all devices connected to app by clicking on the "Me" button at the bottom right of the screen.
- Then click on "Settings" button. From there you can turn on/off all notifications.





REMOVE A DEVICE

- From the home screen, click on the device you would like to remove.
- 2. Then click on the edit symbol on the top right of the screen.
- From there you would then click the "Remove Device" button at the bottom of the screen.





How to control the Smart Hub with Amazon Alexa



Please make sure that your Alexa app is connected to your Amazon Echo and both work together successfully on your Wi-Fi home network.

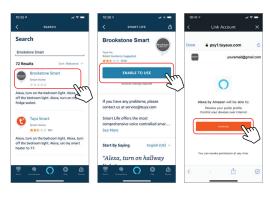
Step A. Log into your Alexa app, tap top left corner, and tap "Skills".





Step B. Type "Brookstone Smart", find "Brookstone Smart" app in the search results and tap "enable" button.

Step C. Enter your account info for the "Brookstone Smart" app, tap "Link Now", then tap "Authorize" on the next page to link Brookstone Smart account to Alexa.

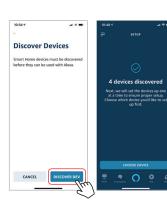


Step D. Once your Brookstone Smart account is successfully linked to Alexa, the next page will pop up. Tap "Done" on the top left corner, then tap "Discover Devices" on the next page.

Step E. Wait a few seconds for Alexa to detect the Smart Hub from the Brookstone Smart app and you will find the device named "Smart Hub" has been paired to Alexa app from the "Brookstone Smart" app.

Since the Smart Hub has three outlets, the device will show as four devices. One for the Smart Hub as a whole and one for each of the outlets. This way they can be named four different names and be controlled separately.

When you click on a device you can then name them what you choose.





After **Step E** is done, you can now control the Smart Hub with Alexa app from the devices page.



Step F. Now you are able to control the Smart Hub via Amazon Alexa. Any device plugged into the plug will turn on and off with Alexa.

Try these commands and see what happens by askina Alexa:

- · Alexa, turn on "device name"
 - · Alexa, turn off "device name"

Note: The device name is the one you give to the Smart Hub on "Brookstone Smart" app.
(You can also name each individual outlet and tell Alexa to turn on/off each one.)
Let's name it "Living Room".
For example, now you can say:

- or example, now you can say:
 "Alexa, turn on Living Room",
 - "Alexa, turn off Living Room", etc.

How to control the Smart Plug with Google Assistant

 Pair Smart Plug with Brookstone Smart App and name it with an easily recognizable name.



 Download the Google Home App and register and log in with your Google Account info.

Step A. Once you are logged into your Google Home App, you should see buttons at the top to connect your Brookstone Smart account to the Google Home App.

Step B. Tap the Brookstone Smart button to link your account with Google Assistant.



Step C. Enter your account info for the "Brookstone Smart" app, tap "Link now", then tap "Authorize" on the next page to link your Brookstone Smart Account with Google Assistant.





Step D. You will find that Google Assistant has found the device named "Smart Plug" on this page.

Scroll down on the home page to see the devices linked to you. You can now control the device through the Google Home App.





Step E. Now you can control your Smart Hub by turning it on or off with Google.

Just start with "Hey Google".

"Turn on device name"
"Turn off device name"

Note: The device name is the one you give to the switch on "Brookstone Smart" App. Let's name it "Living Room". (You can also name each individual outlet and tell Google to turn on/off each one.)

For example:
"Turn on Living Room"
"Turn off Living Room"
