

Attaching to a Rockler® Steel Stand

- 1. Align holes in the bottom of the Cast Iron Tabletop (1) with mounting holes in the Rockler® Router Table Steel Stand (48426, sold separately). Fig. 1.
- 2. Secure with four 1/4"-20 x 3/4" Truss Head Machine Screws (2). The remaining four 1/4"-20 x 3/4" Truss Head Machine Screws are for mounting the optional Dust Right® Dust Bucket (56248, sold separately). **Fig. 1.**

Leveling the Router Plate

1. Fit the insert plate (sold separately) in the center opening of the Cast Iron Tabletop (1).

that have three holes, install Leveling Set Screws only in the two outer holes. The center hole is for securing the router plate (sold separately).

- 2. Working from the underside of the table, thread eight 1/4"-20 x 1" Plate Leveling Set Screws (3) in the adjustment holes. Then install a 1/4" Split Lock Washer (4) and a 1/4"-20 Hex Nut (5) on the bottom of each Leveling Set Screw. **Fig. 2.**
- **3.** Use the Hex Wrench (6) to adjust the 1/4"-20 x 1" Plate Leveling Set Screws (3) until the router plate is flush with the Cast Iron Tabletop (1).
- 4. Hold each 1/4"-20 x 1" Plate Leveling Set Screw (3) with the Hex Wrench (6) and use a 7/16" wrench to tighten the 1/4"-20 Hex Nut (5). This will prevent the Leveling Set Screws from moving. You may need to fine tune the settings after installing your router.
- 5. Once the router plate is level with the table all the way around, use the plate locking bolts that came with the router plate to secure it in place.


