



Quick-Start Guide

Ventilation Controls

- The FILTER button will light up when it is time to clean the grease filter and trays, after about 40 hours of use. For in-depth cleaning instructions, read the Cleaning Your Grease Filter section below.
 - After cleaning, press and hold the FILTER button for 3 seconds to reset the tracker.
 - of If you frequently use a grill, wok, or cook high-grease foods, you may need to clean the filter more often.
- To reduce the risk of a grease fire, clean ventilating fans frequently. Grease should not be allowed to accumulate on fan or filter.
- ° Never use the hood without the grease filter.

- Pressing **DELAY** immediately turns your ventilation on and runs the blower at full speed for 10 minutes.
- Ventilation already on? Pessing **DELAY** won't raise the speed of your blower, but it will automatically shut off in 10 minutes.
- Need to end sooner? Press 0 on your display to turn your blower off early.
- Selecting AUTO mode allows the blower to turn on and off automatically when heat is detected.
- If the hood detects excessive heat, the AUTO button will blink 3 times and the fan will increase in speed. The fan cannot be lowered until the hood has cooled down.



Ventilation Tips and Tricks

- Turn the blower on 5 minutes prior to cooking to remove heat, smoke, grease, and cooking odors more quickly and efficiently.
- Prevent drafts when possible. These may reduce the effectiveness of your hood.
- For best results, use a rear burner when producing high amounts of smoke or steam, like when browning or pan frying meat.

Cleaning Your Grease Filter

- Your grease filter is dishwasher safe, though slight discoloration may occur. This will not affect the effectiveness of your filter.
 - Loosely place the filters on the top rack of your dishwasher and run a normal wash cycle with detergent.
 - Avoid washing extremely dirty grease filters with other dishes.
- Want to wash by hand? Soak the filter in hot water and gentle soap. Then rinse well and shake to dry.
 - Use a gentle brush for tough grease. If necessary, a degreaser may be used.

- Always wait until your ventilation has cooled to remove grease filters.
- Grease filters should be completely dry before replacing in your hood.

Cleaning and Care

- For general care, wipe the inside and outside of your hood with warm, soapy water and a soft cloth. Do NOT use abrasive cleaners or sponges.

- Wipe controls with a lightly damp, soapy sponge. Rinse and dry thoroughly with a soft cloth.
- To clean stainless steel, wipe down using a soft cloth and mild, soapy water and wipe dry.
 Always wipe in the direction of the grain.
- After washing your stainless steel, use the Thermador Stainless Steel Conditioner for extra shine.

- Apply with a soft cloth in the direction of the grain, then wipe away any excess.
- It is not necessary to condition black, smudge-proof or easy-clean steel after cleaning, rather wash these types of steel with mild, soapy water and a soft cloth.
- DO NOT use conditioner on non-steel surfaces, logos, control markings, and appliance interiors.
