


PRODUCT USE AND CARE


Assembly Instructions

Attach the short frame and short brace to legs, fix them together by using M8X12 carriage bolts, 8mm flat washers and M8 hex nuts.Repeat this step to assemble the remaining short frame, short brace and legs.







Attach the long frame and long brace to the assembled legs, fix them by using M8X12 carriage bolts, 8mm flat washers and M8 hex nuts. Repeat this step to assemble another long frame and long brace.



Attach four rubber feet to the legs, place the stand to floor and tighten all nuts. Assemble the hooks to the stand by using M6X12 carriage bolts, 6mm flat washers and M6 hex nuts




Place the metal band saw onto the stand, align the mounting holes and fix them by using hex head bolts, flat washers and hex nuts.
