







Important Safety Precautions

When using your Vivitar 4K Waterproof Camcorder, basic safety precautions should always be followed, including the following:

- 1. READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE USING YOUR CAMCORDER.
- Shut down immediate and remove the battery if it is exposed to water or short circuiting.
- 3. Do not allow children or the infirm to play with your camcorder without adult supervision.
- 4. Do not expose your camcorder to excessive heat, flames or fire.
- 5. Always press all buttons or switches carefully. Do not manhandle your camcorder.
- 6. Do not use in extremely dry environments, as this can lead to static discharge during usage.
- 7. Do not expose your camcorder to temperatures above 50°C.
- 8. Do not attempt to repair this product yourself. Contact a qualified service center if your dash cam is in need of service.
- 9. Do not drop, puncture or expose your camcorder to excessive trauma.
- 10. Your camcorder is not intended for commercial use.
- 11. Do not place near objects that generate a strong magnetic field.
- 12. Unplug this device when not in use for long periods of time or during lightning storms.
- 13. Only use the supplied battery. Do not use if the battery has expanded or leaked. If the battery or any parts have been swallowed, seek medical attention immediately.
- 14. Do not operate your camcorder while you are driving an automobile.
- 15. Store in a cool, dry environment when not in use.
- 16. Before use, make sure that the battery has been fully charged and that a suitable memory card inserted.






BOTTOM VIEW

Button Functions





Power Button

- -Press to power on the camcorder.
- -Press and hold to power off the camcorder.





Mode Button

-Press to switch between camera modes.





Menu Button

- -Press to pull up settings menu.
- -Press to exit menu or return to previous menu.



Zoom/Volume Button

- -Zoom in or out in (wide/telephoto) in photo/video mode.
- -Adjust volume during video playback.
- -Toggle through menus.



UP & DOWN Buttons



-Press the UP & DOWN Buttons to toggle through selections on the display screen.




Record/Shutter Button

- -In video mode, press to start and stop recording.
- -In photo mode, press to take a picture.

Inserting a Memory Card

Before powering on your camcorder, insert a Micro SD memory card into the memory card slot. A Micro SD memory card is required in order to store recorded photos and videos. To ensure smooth performance, it is recommended to use a memory card rated class 10 or above, with a capacity between 16-128GB.



To remove the Micro SD card

Push the Micro SD card inward once, then pull it out.


NOTE:

- If a "Card is Full" error message appears on your display screen, you can either delete files or use another card in order to take more photos or videos.
- You may need to format a memory card for the camcorder to recognize it properly. Be sure to backup any files stored on a memory card before formatting, as the formatting process will delete all files stored on the card.

Opening and Closing the Battery Cover

To Open the Battery Cover


- 1.Slide the cover lock downward and hold.
- 2. While holding the cover lock down, push the battery cover to the right.
- 3. Lift the cover slowly.



To Close the Battery Cover

- 1. Flip down the battery cover.
- 2. Press the cover down while sliding it to the left until it clicks into place. Make sure the waterproof seal fits around the edge of the cover.

NOTE: The cover lock automatically goes to LOCK position when battery cover is properly closed. If the security lock is on UNLOCK position, the cover is not properly closed.



CAUTION


Do not let water or debris get inside the battery cover, doing so will result in damage to battery and waterproof seal. Damages or scratches to the waterproof seal and battery cover will compromise waterproofing ability and result in leaks.


Charging the Battery

A rechargeable battery is included with your camcorder.

Open the battery cover and insert battery into the battery slot. The battery should slide securely in place.

Plug the Micro USB Charging Cable into the USB port. Then attach the other end of the cable to a computer or an AV adapter. Plug the AV adapter to an electric outlet.





The charging light indicator will emit a green light while device is charging.


Powering On & Off

Powering On

To power on your camcorder, press the Power button.

Powering Off

Press and hold the Power button to power off your camcorder.



When Powering on, the BUSY light indicator will emit a red light.

NOTES:

- 1. Your camcorder will also power on or power off by opening or closing the screen.
- 2. When not used for an extended period, your camcorder will automatically power off in order to save power.

Switching Modes

Selecting a Mode

To switch between video, photo, and playback mode, press the Mode/OK button while the camcorder screen is on capture.

Each mode will be indicated by their unique screen displays.

Video Mode/Recording Videos

After powering on your camcorder, press the Mode/OK button on the side of your camcorder to switch between modes. Video mode will be indicated by the features on the display screen.

Recording a Video

To record a video, press the Shutter button on your camcorder to start recording a video. Press the Shutter button again to end your video recording.

Default Video Recording Display Screen





Photo Mode/Taking Photos

After powering on your camcorder, press the Mode/OK button on the side of your camcorder to switch between modes. Photo mode will be indicated by the features on the display screen.

Taking a Picture

To take a picture, press the Shutter button to focus and press down all the way to take the picture.

Playback Mode and Deleting Files


To enter playback mode, press the Mode/OK button until you see playback mode display screen.

Once in playback mode, use the Up & Down buttons to toggle through videos or photos. Press the Shutter button on your camcorder to play or pause videos. Use the Zoom/Volume button to adjust volume.


Deleting Files

Select unwanted files and press Menu button to open menu. Use Mode/OK button to Select [DELETE] then select [DELETE THIS FILE] then select [YES/NO]

Playback Mode Display Screen






Playback on a TV

- 1. Connect one of the included HDMI cable to the HDMI port on your camcorder.
- 2. Connect the other end to the HDMI In port on your television.
- 3. Set the TV input to HDMI in.
- 4. Playback images on the camcorder.



Connecting to a Computer

- 1. Connect one end of the included USB-C cable into the USB port on your camcorder.
- 2. Connect the other end to an available USB port on your computer. Once connected your camcorder's battery can be charged or you can transfer files from your camcorder's memory card to your computer.



3. Flip the camcorder screen open. Once connected to the computer, the screen display will look like this:



- 4. To transfer files, select Mass Storage. The computer will display the camcorder's memory card disk and will transfer the files to the memory card.
- 5. Your camcorder will now act similarly to a thumb drive or other mass storage device. In Windows computers, a removable disk drive will mount in your My Computer or My PC window. You can click on this drive to access your photos. On computers running Mac OS an extra drive will mount on your desktop.

Formatting Micro SD Memory Card

You may need to format the memory card for the camcorder to be able to recognize it properly. The Micro SD card file system should be formated to FAT/exFAT.

To format the memory card, press the Menu button twice (or press Menu button once and use the Zoom/Volume button) to open the Setup menu.

In the Setup menu, press the Up & Down buttons to move selection to Format, then press Mode/OK to choose [Format]. Repeat to choose [OK].



NOTE:

Formatting the memory card will erase all of the data stored on it. The data will be irrecoverable.

Make sure to save your important data on a PC before formatting.

Accessing Menus

Each mode has a corresponding menu that is accessed with the Menu button. To change photo or video settings, the corresponding mode must be running. To access photo settings, photo mode must be on. To access video settings, video mode must be on.

The two menu categories are labeled as Photo/Video and Setup.



Press the Zoom/Volume button to shift between camera/video and setup menus.



Use the Up & Down buttons to move through the selections. Press Mode/OK to select an option.

Press the Menu button to go to Setup menu, or press again to exit menu.
