PRECAUTIONS BEFORE USE

KEEP THESE INSTRUCTIONS IN MIND:

- 1. Do not cover or block any ventilation openings. When placing the device on a shelf, leave 5 cm (2') free space around the whole device.
- 2. Install in accordance with the supplied user manual.
- 3. Keep the device away from heat sources such as rad iators, heaters, stoves, candles and other heat-generating products or naked flame. The device can only be used in moderate c limates. Extremely cold or warm environments should be avoided. Working temperature between o• and 35•c.
- 4. Avoid using the device near strong magnetic fields.
- 5. Electrostatic discharge can disturb normal usage of this device. If so, simply reset and restart the device following the instruction manual. During file transmission, please handle with care and operate in a static-free environment.
- 6. Warning I Never insert an object into the product through the vents or openings. High voltage flows through the product and in serting an object can cause electric shock and/or short c ircuit internal parts. For the same reason, do not spill water or liquid on the product.
- 7. Do not use in wet or moist areas such as bathrooms, steamy kitchens or near swimming pools.

4.5 Compact Discs

Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped off the discs recorded side wilh a sdfl. cloth. Unlike
conventional records, compact discs have no grooves to collect dusk so gently wiping with a piece of soft cloth

This Product plays tapes in the format Compact Cassette. The product does not support other rape formats. When playing home recorded cassettes the playback quality might be influenced by the quality of the recording equipment and of the blank cassette used

5.1 Inserting and Removing a Cassette
