Setup Instructions

- 1. Connect the controller to the computer using the supplied USB cable. This will power up the device. Note that self-powered USB hubs can be used, but other devices with USB 3.0 may cause problems.
- 2. Select the device as a MIDI controller within your DAW (Digital Audio Workstation) software.

Device Settings in Your DAW

- 1. Connect the controller to the computer via the USB cable.
- 2. Open your DAW software.
- 3. Access the preferences, options, or device setup of your DAW.
- 4. Set up the device as a hardware controller.
- 5. For more information on the controller's mapping settings for the DAW, refer to the full user guide available online.

FAQ

The display/LEDs do not light up

Cause: No power. Make sure the controller is properly connected and powered.

Problem: No sound from your controller

Cause: Your controller is a MIDI controller and does not contain any sounds inside. Make sure your controller is properly connected to the target device.

Problem: Keys/Pads/Knobs/Sliders not working

Cause: Your controller's settings may not be properly mapped to your DAW. Refer to the full user guide for information on mapping settings.

Problem: Drivers fail to install

Cause: There may be compatibility issues with your computer operating system. Make sure your computer meets the minimum system requirements.

Problem: Your controller fails to connect to the computer

Cause: There may be a problem with the USB port on your computer. Try connecting to a different USB port or using a powered USB hub.

Problem: Sustain Pedal not working when connected to Pedal A jack

Cause: The sustain pedal function may not be properly assigned to Control No. 64. Check the settings and assign the correct function.

Problem: Knob 5 is not working with the software application as other knobs

Cause: Knob 5 may not be set to General MIDI Controller, which is required for compatibility with software

applications. Check the settings and make the necessary adjustments.

Problem: Your controller is not working properly with software applications

Cause: Ensure that your software application is set to receive MIDI data from your controller. Check if the MIDI channel of your controller matches the incoming MIDI channel of the application.

Problem: Volume slider doesn't change the volume in the software application

Cause: The volume slider may not be properly mapped to control the volume in the software application. Check the settings and mapping in your DAW.

Introduction

This MIDI controller is used to control music software. The device does not produce sound unless it is connected to a computer or other external MIDI device. This is because it does not produce sound itself and only sends MIDI data when you play it. Instead, it controls a virtual instrument on your computer or a MIDI sound module to produce sounds. The controller can be connected to PC and Mac computers. An OTG converter cable is required to connect to mobile phones and tablets. For Apple, use the Lightning to USB 3 camera adapter.

Setup

- 1. Connect the controller to the computer using the supplied USB cable. This will power up the device. Self-powered USB hubs can be used, but other devices with USB 3.0 will cause problems.
- 2. Select the device as MIDI controller within your DAW and you are ready to go

Device settings in your DAW

To select your controller as a MIDI controller for your digital audio workstation (DAW):

- 1. Connect the controller to the computer via a USB cable.
- 2. Open your DAW.
- 3. Open the preferences, options, or device setup of your DAW. Set up the device as a hardware controller. The

- controller can now communicate with your software.

	Your controller is not properly c onnected.	Check your computer's USB connection to confirm that y our controller is recognized. If necessary, plug the USB c able and restart your computer.
	Your controller was connected after the software application had started.	If controlling an external hardware module, make sure that your controller's MIDI OUT is connected to the device's MIDI IN port.
	The problem is caused by use o f a USB hub.	Unplug your controller from the USB hub and connect it directly to your computer.

No sound from the target device	Software application not set to r eceive MIDI data from your cont roller.	Ensure that your controller is listed as an active MIDI source in your application. Usually, the MIDI settings can be accessed through the application's Preferences men u.
	Your controller's MIDI channel i s not the same as the applicatio n's incoming MIDI channel.	Make sure that your controller is sending MIDI information on the channel that the target device expects.
Keys/Pads/Knobs/ Slide rs not work	Keys/Pads/Knobs/Sliders not s et to mapping to your DAW.	Please make sure you have set your controller to map to your DAW manually. For more mapping info please visit the download the full user manual online.
Drivers fail to insta	There is a problem with the computer's USB port.	Your controller is a driver-free device, so basically, no dri ver is required for this device. Please try to use your cont roller on another USB port or even on another computer.
Your controller fail s to connect to a c omputer	Fail to connect to a computer.	Check your computer's USB connection to confirm that y our controller is recognized.
Sustain Pedal not working when con nected to Pedal A jack	Pedal A jack is not assigned to Control No. 64 which is the function of sustain pedal.	Assign the Pedal A jack to Control No. 64 when connecting your sustain pedal to it.
Knob 5 is not work ing with the softwa re application as o ther	Knob 5 is not set to General MI DI Controller which is required t o be compatible with software a pplications.	The default setting for Knob 5 is Program Change. Assig n Knob 5 to the General MIDI Controller first before usin g it for other functions in the software application.
Your controller is not working properly with soft ware applications	The mapping settings of the controller for the software applic ation are not complete. 


Computer

The controller is bus-powered, so it turns on as soon as you connect it to your computer with a USB cable




iOS devices

To operate the controller with an iOS device, use Apple's Lightning to USB 3 Camera Adapter with a separate 2.4A Lightning charger




Android devices

To operate the controller with an Android device we'd like to recommend a USB OTG to USB adapter



Stand-alone operation

The 3.5mm TRS MIDI Out port can be used to connect the controller to a hardware sequencer, an external synthesizer, or a sound module. If you want to use the 3.5mm TRS MIDI output without a computer, you can power the unit with standard USB power
