

## Warning

- 1. The appliance is to be continuously attended;
- 2. The sauna room or cabin is ta be inspected before setting the appliance to a standby mode for a delayed start.
- 3. Cleaning with steam cleaners, high pressure cleaners and spraying water is not allowed.
- 4. it is recommended that the infrared ca bin should not be used within 24 h after UV radiation exposure from artificial sources or sun-bathing;
- 5. individuals who may be at risk from hyperthermia, such as individuals suffering from cardiovascular disease, should seek medical advice before use of infrared warming cabins;
- 6. when persistent erythema (reddening of the skin lasting more than a day) a nd netlike colour changes persist

- after regular exposure to infrared radiation, exposure should not be repeated and medical advice should be sought to prevent development of erythema ab igne;
- 7. if you are a person with compromised heat pain sensation or under the influence of alcohol or tranquilizers you should not use infrared warming cabins.
- 8. a pilot lamp showing that the heater or infrared emitter is switched on is to be installed in the attendant 's room.
- 9. This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
  - Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- 10. If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

### Important safety guides




Please strictly follow safety precautions when using!

- 1. Children must be using the equipment under the core of on adult. For safety, do not ploy with ii;
- 2. Do not insert objects such as fingers or sticks into the heating tube plate to prevent danger;
- 3. Never pour water to the equipment or the heating pipe (board);
- 4. Do not use or store flammable gas or liquid such as hair spray, oil point, gasoline, etc near the equipment to ovoid fire;
- 5. Do not place items inside or on top of the sauna;
- 6. Do not touch the power control panel and any electrical components with wet hands to prevent electric shock;
- 7. It is forbidden to use the equipment during thunderstorms to prevent electric shock;
- 8. Do not tilt the equipment, do not use sharp objects to strike;
- 9. Shut down the equipment for half on hour after 4 hours continuous working;
- 10. Do not operate the equipment in a long-term high temperature environment;
- 11. Use with caution after drinking alcohol;
- 12. Those who hove hemophilia or ore prone to bleeding should ovoid using it;
- 13. Please consult your doctor before using if you ore in period of disease and toking medicine;
- 14. Do not use after intense exercise, wait until the body temperature returns to normal before using;
- 15. If you feel any discomfort. please stop using immediately;
- 16. Mind your head when get in and out of the equipment;
- 17. Do not sleep inside the equipment when it is working;
- 18. Do not use any both products in the sauna;
- 19. To ovoid burns. do not touch the heating element;
- 20. WARNING: Covering the heater or infrared emitter causes fire risk!

#### **Attention:**

- 1. The minimum distance between the top of an infrared emitter and the ceiling of the cabinis 100 mm;
- 2. The minimum distance between the bottom of an infrared emitter and the floor of the cabin is 40 mm, unless this distance is determined by the construction of the infrared emitter;
- 3. The minimum horizontal distance between an infrared emitter and any combustible material of the cabin is 5 mm, unless these distances are determined by the construction of the infrared emitter;
- 4. The minimum distance between adjacent infrared emitters is 5 mm.

















Suitable for processes 3 and 4 Installation method of The left and right side panels




Suitable for process 8 Installation method of the front board




The product is connected to the main power supply through the cable.

the brown core of the cable is connected to the live wire of the main power supply, the blue core is connected to the neutral wire of the main power supply, and the yellow green core is connected to the ground wire of the main power supply

## **Control panel operation**

- 1. Temperate display screen For temperate.
- 2. Timer display screen For timer.
- 3. USB function

Touch this key to start USB function.

#### 4. Light button

#### 7. Time control



Long press LOCK button for SS. indicator light is on. it means the button is locked. Long press this button again for 5S to unlock the button. indicator lamp is not light.




### **Control box**


This control box is the control center of sauna room, it is installed on the top board. input/output connections as below.

- 1. Main power of sauna room.
- 2. Lamp power output cable
- 3. Heaters power output cable (LOAD A-LOAD F)
- 4. Fuse reset
- 5. 12V output

## Maintance

Before using	<ol> <li>Please be sure to follow the instruction manual before operations;</li> <li>Prepare o towel on the seat bench to prevent sweat tram dripping onto it. To ov oid affecting the quality and beauty of wood.</li> </ol>		
After using	1. Please unplug the power plug in time; 2. Open the door to let the heat and humid water vapor dissipate and keep the sauna cabin dry.		
Stain on wood	<ol> <li>The outer cabin con be wiped with o wrung wet towel; The inner cabin con be w iped by small vacuum cleaner.</li> <li>Do not use organic solvents to decontaminate. such as gasoline. alcohol. etc. w ipe the sauna surface:</li> <li>Do not use sharp objects in sauna cabin to prevent scratching woods.</li> </ol>		
Stain on glass	<ol> <li>Wipe the glass with soft paper;</li> <li>Stubborn stains can be wiped with a damp cloth. then dry with a dry cloth;</li> <li>Do not scratch the surface with o sharp object to prevent scratching the gloss.</li> </ol>		
Transportation and storage	<ol> <li>Avoid water. snow and intense impact during the transportation;</li> <li>Do not store it in o humid environment;</li> <li>The northern climate is relatively dry, often wipe the product with a wrung wet t owel;</li> <li>The climate in the south is relatively humid and con be ventilated and dried freq uently.</li> </ol>
