
TYPES OF DOG CRATES

CRATE	PROS	CONS
Collapsible	Easy to store and transport, convenient for travel or temporary use, and offer a good balance of durability and portability.	May not be as sturdy as heavy-duty crates but far superior to wire and plastic options in terms of security and durability.
Stationary	Extremely durable, great for large or strong dogs, advanced safety features, resistant to escape attempts.	Heavier and more expensive but provide the best security and peace of mind, especially for high-energy or anxious dogs.
Separation Anxiety	Specifically designed to soothe anxious dogs, provides a secure and comforting environment, reduces stress and escape attempts.	Can be more expensive due to specialized features but worth the investment for dogs with severe anxiety.
Wire	Excellent ventilation, easy to clean, lower cost.	Can be noisy, less durable, and easier for dogs to escape from, making them less ideal for strong or anxious dogs.
Plastic	Can be good for travel, more enclosed which provides a den-like feel.	Less ventilation, bulkier to store, harder to clean, and not as durable. Easier for determined dogs to break out of.

DETERMINING THE RIGHT CRATE SIZE

MEASURING YOUR DOG

- Step 1: Measure from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail for length.
- Step 2: Measure from the ground to the top of the head for height.
- Step 3: Add 2-4 inches to both measurements to ensure enough room for movement and comfort.
