SNAP POWER Hug Lock Latches With Indexing Function




Description

The HugLock is a child-resistant door lock designed specifically for interior doors such as pantries, closets, bathrooms and bedrooms. However, the HugLock is a convenience device to limit a child's access to certain areas, not a substitute for adult supervision and is not intended to be a primary safety device.

Benefits


- Child-Resistant Design: The HugLock is placed on doors out of the reach of children and keeps them from opening doors that should remain shut.
- Easy Installation: The HugLock installs in seconds over the edge of your door, without the need for tools or adhesives.
- Adjustable Height: Fits around the edge of the door either on the vertical side or on the top edge, out of the reach of young children.
- Durable Construction: Withstands up to 50 lbs. (22.5 kg) of opening force.
- Convenient Operation: Designed to be easily operated from either side of the door.
- No Damage: No need for permanent changes to your door structure. Will not cause damage to door, frame, or paint.
- Versatile: Works with any style of door knob or lever.




How the HugLock Works

- The HugLock fits over the edge of an interior door.



Installation Instructions



Step 1: Select the interior door you want to secure and determine the location of the HugLock on the door




Step 2: Push the HugLock over the edge of the door



Step 3: Close the door


When the door is closed, the latch automatically engages with the existing door jamb and prevents the door from opening.



Step 4: Open the door

To open the door from the latch side of the door, press the latch to disengage it from the door jamb.

To open the door from the opposite side, move the release slider away from the edge of the door.



Using the Disable Switch

The disable switch secures the latch in a retracted position. This prevents the latch from engaging the door jamb and locking the door.

To engage the disable switch:

- 1. Push the latch back into latch body.
- 2. Push the disable switch toward the latch. The latch is now secured in its retracted position and will not lock the door.

To release the latch, move the disable switch downward. The latch will then fully extend.

TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS


ISSUE	TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS
You can't fit the HugLo ck over your door.	Is your door 1 %" (35 mm) thick? If not, you will need to use the HugLock on a different door. "Door Geometry"
	Is the HugLock bracket pushed all the way against the edge of the door? "HugLock Fit"
The door won't shut wi th the HugLock installe d.	Is the gap between the door and the door frame at least 0.05 " (1.2 mm) wide? If not, try installing the HugLock in a differe nt location on the door where there is a larger gap. "Door Gaps"
	You could use the HugLock on the top edge of the door where gravity will help hold it on. "Placement"
	Slightly bend the bracket together for better grip, reinstall the HugLock.
The HugLock falls off the door during use.	Is your door less than 1 %" thick? The HugLock only works on standard interior doors. "Door Geometry"
	Look for reasons the latch is not catching on the door jamb. I s the door jamb less than ½" thick and less than 1

Frequently monitor your door for damage. If you begin to see wear on frequently used doors, consider moving the HugLoc k to a different location, such as along the top of the door.

Compatible Door Geometry

- Door Thickness: The HugLock is designed to fit around standard interior doors that are 1 %" (35 mm) thick.
- Door Gap: To ensure the door closes properly with the HugLock installed, there must be a gap of at least 0.05 (1.2 mm) between the door and the door frame.




Door Thickness: The HugLock is designed to fit around standard interior doors that are 1 3/8" (35 mm) thick.

Compatible Trim – Door Jambs

- The HugLock is designed to grip door jamb that is thinner than $\frac{1}{2}$ " (12.5 mm) and less than $\frac{1}{2}$ " (38 mm) deep.
- The HugLock is compatible with a wide range of trim, including square trim (A), profiled trims (B, C) and rounded trim (D).




Door Gaps

There must be a gap of at least 0.05 (1.2 mm) between the door and the door frame. Depending on how your door is installed and the age of your home, your doors can have varying gaps between the frame and the door. If the Door doesn't close with the Huglock in one location, try moving it to another location around the door.




HugLock Fit

Be sure there is no space between the bracket and the edge of the door. The bracket should tightly hug the edge of the door. If there is a gap, it can prevent the door from closing.

HugLock Usage Guidelines

The HugLock is for managing a child's access within the home for convenience, not as a primary safety device.

Supervision:

The HugLock is not a substitute for adult supervision. Parents and guardians must always be vigilant. Always consider your child's capability and strength. For example, a child who stands on a chair can open a HugLock that would otherwise be out of reach. A motivated older child may be capable of applying more than 50 lbs. of force to the HugLock.

Supplemental Safety:

Use the HugLock alongside other childproofing devices for areas with potential hazards.

Appropriate Uses for HugLock:

- Controlled Access: Prevents children from entering non-hazardous rooms like home offices, laundry rooms, pantries, or storage areas.
- Organizing Play Areas: Keeps children in designated play areas. Managing Pet Access: Controls pet movement while allowing adult access. Privacy for Adults: Provides privacy in rooms like bedrooms or home offices.

Hazards Should Be Separately Secured

- Hazardous materials such as cleaning supplies, medications, weapons, or tools should be separately secured.
- Stairs: Should be supplemented with safety gates or other devices. Outdoor Areas: Requires additional locks and alarms for doors leading to pools or streets.
- Kitchens: Needs other safety devices and supervision to protect against sharp objects, hot surfaces, and other hazards.


