

Hardware Setup

Tools and Parts for Drive Installation

- · A screwdriver.
- At least one 3.5" or 2.5" SATA drive (please visit www.synology.com for compatible drive models.)

Warning

If you install a drive that contains data, the system will format the drive and erase all existing data. Please back up important data before installation.

Install Rack mounts

Fix the two rack mount kits on both sides with the screws provided.



install Drives

1. Pull the drive tray handle outwards to remove the tray.



2. Load drives into the drive trays.



• For 3.5" drives: Place the drive in the drive tray. Turn the tray upside down and tighten the screws into the four spots indicated below to secure the drive.



• For 2.5" drives: Place the drive in the drive tray. Turn the tray upside down and tighten the screws into the four spots indicated below to secure the drive.



- Insert the loaded drive tray into the empty drive bay.
 Important: Make sure the drive tray is pushed in or the drive may not function properly.
- 4. Push the handle inward to secure the drive tray.



5. Insert the drive tray key into the drive tray lock, turn the key clockwise to lock the handle of the drive tray, and remove the key.



- 6. Repeat the steps above to install all prepared drives.
- 7. Drives are numbered as shown below.

Note: If you want to create a RAID volume, we recommend installing drives of the same size. This would optimize drive capacity usage.

Add RAM Modules to RackStation

The optional Synology RAM module is designed for RackStation memory expansion. Follow the steps below to install, check, or remove a RAM module on your RackStation

To install a RAM module

- 1. Shut down your RackStation and disconnect all cables to prevent any possible damage.
- 2. Remove the top cover:

• Loosen the four screws of the top cover of your RackStation with a screwdriver. The respective screw position is indicated above.



Push the top cover towards the front of your RackStation and lift it.
 Note: When you remove the top cover, you expose sensitive internal components.



3. Avoid touching anything other than the memory assembly when you remove or add memory.

White Slots


Black Slots Note

- 1. For normal operations, you must insert your RAM modules into the white slots first.
- 2. Synology will not provide a complete product warranty or technical support if non-Synology RAM modules are used for memory upgrades.

Chapter 2: Hardware Setup

Insert the new memory module

- Push the retaining clips on the slot outwards.
- Align the gold edge of the module with the memory slot.
- Firmly push the memory module down. The retaining clips will snap into position if the module is correctly inserted.



• Important: Hold the memory module by its edges. Do not touch the golden connectors.

To make sure RackStation recognizes the new memory capacity

- 1. Install DiskStation Manager (DSM). (See Install DSM with Web Assistant for more information.)
- 2. Log in to DSM as an admin or a user in the administrator's group.
- 3. Check Total Physical Memory in Control Panel > Info Center.
- 4. If your RackStation does not recognize the memory or does not start up successfully, confirm that the memory is installed correctly.

To remove a RAM Module


- 1. Follow steps 1 and 2 of Add RAM Modules to RackStation to shut down your RackStation. Disconnect all cables and remove the top cover.
- 2. Disengage the memory-retaining clips by pushing them outwards. The module will pop out of the slot.
- 3. Follow To return the top cover to put back the top cover.



Attach SSDs to RackStation

Your RackStation supports optional M.2 2280 NVMe / SATA SSDs. Follow the steps below to add them to your RackStation.

1. Follow steps 1 and 2 of Add RAM Modules to RackStation to shut down your RackStation. Disconnect all cables and remove the top cover.



- 2. Insert an M.2 SATA SSD into SLOT1 (as shown below). Insert a second SSD in SLOT 2 if needed.
- 3. Tighten the SSD(s) with a screw


Important: Hold the SSD module by its edges and do not touch the golden connectors.

Attach A Network Interface Card to RackStation

Your RackStation supports one PCIe x8 add-on network interface card.1

To install a network interface card

- 1. Follow steps 1 and 2 of Add RAM Modules to RackStation to shut down your RackStation.
- 2. Disconnect all cables and remove the top cover.
- 3. Insert your network interface card.



- Lift the black latch from the expansion slot cover. Remove the cover from the expansion slot.
- Align the gold connectors of the network interface card to the expansion slot and firmly insert the card.
- Put the black latch back into the expansion slot to fasten the network interface card.

Note: Make sure the connector is fully inserted or the network interface card may not function properly.

To return the top cover

1. Align the round dots on the side of the top cover with the slots on the chassis edge, then push the top cover back into position.



2. Fasten the four removed screws in step 2 To install a RAM module

Replace Redundant Power Supplies on RackStation

- 1. Turn to the back of your RackStation and push the lever of the redundant power supply.
- 2. Pull the redundant power supply out.



3. Prepare a new power supply and push it into the slot until you hear a click.

Start-Up RackStation

- 1. Turn to the back of your RackStation. Connect one end of each power cord to the power ports and the other end to a power outlet.
- 2. Connect at least one LAN cable to one of the LAN ports and the other end to your switch, router, or hub.



3. Press the power button to turn on the RackStation.



4. Congratulations! Your RackStation is now online and detectable from a network computer.

Install DSM on RackStation

after the hardware setup is finished, please install DiskStation Manager (DSM) – Synology's browser-based operating system – on your RackStation.

Install DSM with Web Assistant

Your RackStation comes with a built-in tool called Web Assistant that helps you download the latest version of DSM from the Internet and install it on your RackStation. To use Web Assistant, please follow the steps below.

- 1. Power on your RackStation.
- 2. Open a web browser on a computer connected to the same network as the RackStation.
- 3. Enter either of the following into the address bar of your browser:
 - find.synology.com
 - rackstation:5000
- 4. Web Assistant will be launched in your web browser. It will search for and find the RackStation within the local network. The status of the RackStation should be Not Installed.



5. Click Connect to start the setup process and follow the onscreen instructions.

Note

- 1. The RackStation must be connected to the Internet to install DSM with Web Assistant.
- 2. Suggested browsers: Chrome, Firefox.
- 3. Your RackStation and computer must be in the same local network.
- 4. If you accidentally leave the installation process before it is finished, log in to the DSM as admin (default administrative account name) with the password left blank.

Further, if this Warranty conflicts with any terms or conditions of any other agreement entered into by the parties concerning the Product, this Warranty will prevail unless the other agreement specifically references the sections of this Warranty that it supersedes.
- Applicable Law. Unless explicitly prohibited by local law, this Warranty is governed by the laws of the State of Washington, U.S.A. for the Customers residing within the United States; and by the laws of the Republic of China (Taiwan) for Customers not residing within the United States, without regard to any conflict of law principles to the contrary. The 1980 U.N. Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods or any successor thereto does not apply.
- Dispute Resolution. Any dispute, controversy, or claim arising out of or relating to this Warranty, the Product, or services provided by Synology concerning the Product, or the relationship between Customers residing within the United States and Synology will be resolved exclusively and finally by arbitration under the current commercial rules of the American Arbitration Association, except as otherwise provided below. The arbitration will be conducted before a single arbitrator and will be limited solely to the dispute between Customer and Synology. The arbitration, or any portion of it, will not be consolidated with any other arbitration and will not be conducted on a class-wide or class-action basis. The arbitration shall be held in King County, Washington, U.S.A. by submission of documents, by telephone, online, or in person as determined by the arbitrator at the request of the parties. The prevailing party in any arbitration or legal action occurring within the United States or otherwise shall receive all costs and reasonable attorneys' fees, including any arbitration fee paid by the prevailing party. Any decision rendered in such arbitration proceedings will be final and binding on the parties, and judgment may be entered thereon in any court of competent jurisdiction. Customer understands that, in the absence of this provision, Customer would have had a right to litigate any such dispute, controversy, or claim in a court, including the right to litigate claims on a class-wide or class-action basis, and Customer expressly and knowingly waives those rights and agrees to resolve any disputes through binding arbitration by the provisions of this Section 5.5.
- For Customers not residing within the United States, any dispute, controversy, or claim described in this section shall be finally resolved by arbitration conducted by three neutral arbitrators by the procedures of the R.O.C. Arbitration Law and related enforcement rules. The arbitration shall take place in Taipei, Taiwan, R.O.C., and

the arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in English or, if both parties so agree, in Mandarin Chinese. The arbitration award shall be final and binding on the parties and may be enforced in any court having jurisdiction. Nothing in this Section shall be deemed to prohibit or restrict Synology from seeking injunctive relief or seeking such other rights and remedies as it may have at law or equity for any actual or threatened breach of any provision of this Warranty relating to Synology's intellectual property rights.

- Attorneys' Fees. In any arbitration, mediation, or other legal action or proceeding to enforce rights or remedies
 under this Warranty, the prevailing party will be entitled to recover, in addition to any other relief to which it may
 be entitled, costs and reasonable attorneys' fees. Export Restrictions. You acknowledge that the Product may
 be subject to U.S. export restrictions. You will comply with
 all applicable laws and regulations that apply to the Product, including without limitation the U.S. Export
 Administration Regulations.
- Severability. If any provision of this Warranty is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the remainder of this Warranty will remain in full force and effect.
- Entire Agreement. This Warranty constitutes the entire agreement and supersedes any prior agreements, between Synology and Customer related to the subject matter hereof. No amendment, modification, or waiver of any of the provisions of this Warranty will be valid unless outlined in a written instrument signed by the party to be bound thereby.
